What are some of the things as a Property Owner you should be aware of during these seasons, especially those who are new to Woodhaven? Here are just a few questions I think you may have over these upcoming months.

What is open during the late fall and winter months?

First off, please check the Woodhaven app to confirm the hours since they are limited.

Who should I contact for snow removal or winterizing?

Please refer to the Contractor's List where we list contractors who have provided current insurance information on file and have a permit to work on Woodhaven property. This list can be found at the Association office, on the app, and on the Member's side of the website.

What services are available during this time?

- Leaf pickup starts in November
- Snow removal starts when we have 3+ inches on the roads
- Public Safety performs lot to lot walk-throughs starting late Fall
- ESAC
- Association Office for all Woodhaven informational needs

Lee County Delinquent Taxes

Woodhaven lot owners are responsible for paying a real estate tax bill to the Lee County Treasurer each year. This year real estate taxes bills were due on July 2, 2021, and the second installment on September 3, 2021. We recently received information from the Lee County Treasurer's Office on the number of Woodhaven properties that are delinquent in taxes this year. This number, totaling approximately 800 properties is consistent with previous year totals at this time and we expect many of the balances to be paid prior to October 27, 2021, tax sale date. If you have not paid or are not sure if you paid your real estate taxes, please contact the Lee County Treasurer's Office at (815) 288-4477 at your earliest convenience to make sure you do not incur additional expenses.



Any unpaid taxes will be offered for sale on Wednesday, October 27th at the Old Court House Building beginning at 9:00 a.m. At that time, delinquent fees and charges will be added to the unpaid balance of any delinquent property in Lee County. Again, if you have doubts about the status of your Woodhaven property tax bill, please do not hesitate in calling the Lee County Treasurers' Office.



Association staff members will attend the tax sale to observe these activities and evaluate if there are any significant changes with the number of properties delinquent in real estate taxes this year.

Budget Update

The 2022-2023 budget process is in full swing as the Association's Finance Committee, Facilities Planning Committee, and Board of Directors held several meetings to establish an assessment plan supporting our current and long-term objectives. On October 1st and October 2nd, budget workshops were held allowing Board and Committee members to meet with department managers and review specific information on the Association's operating activities, capital projects, debt financing plans, and future reserve funding plans. Additional meetings have and will take place in October and early November to further define our budget and prepare it for presentation to the membership at the November 13th Budget Hearing. This hearing will take place at 1:00 p.m. at the Association's Rec Plex Multipurpose Room. We are also planning to offer access to this presentation via Zoom through a registration process. If an Owner is interested in participating via Zoom, please contact the Association Office to be placed on the contact list and include your email address to receive the Zoom link. The Budget Hearing will be recorded, and a copy of the hearing presentation will be available to be viewed on Woodhaven's YouTube account.

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All loans are subject to credit approval. Fees may apply.

The Budget Hearing provides Property Owners with an opportunity to make comments, suggestions, and request more information on the Association's budget. A copy of the hearing packet will be published in the next issue of the *Woodhaven News*, and available for further review of the Membership. The presentation includes the recommended assessments along with an updated long-term assessment plan. All Owners are encouraged to take time to be informed and participate in the budget process.

Following the hearing, the information received will be evaluated by each Committee and a final assessment recommendation will be made and presented to the Board of Directors for approval at their December Board Meeting. The Board of Directors will be holding meetings on Tuesday, November 16th and Tuesday, December 14th via Zoom. Owners with additional questions and/or comments about the Association's budget are encouraged to submit speak-up sheets specifically asking for items to be discussed by the Board of Directors. Each meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will include a discussion on questions and comments received from Owners. Approval of the 2022-2023 assessments, including specific fund allocations, will be placed on the December 14, 2021 Board Meeting Agenda.

The following charts provide information on the proposed assessments for 2022-2023. The highlighted sections show what the projected assessments were at the beginning of the budget process, and the amended allocations are shown in the adjacent column. The current recommendation is for assessments to remain at \$1,360 on lots with sewer services and \$1,235 on lots without sewer services. The long-range plans are projecting assessments to increase in FY 2023-2024 to \$1,485 on lots with sewer services and \$1,365 on lots without sewer services.

We will continue to provide updated information on the budget process and encourage Property Owners to consider attending the annual Budget Hearing on November 13th, 1:00 p.m. at the Association's Rec Plex.

Electric Aggregation Information

In June of 2020, Lee County entered into a 3-year municipal aggregation contract with AEP Energy with a fixed electric supply rate of \$0.05634/kWh. The terms for the new contract provide this rate for the entire 3-year term, ending with the July 2023 meter read. This program replaced the prior 3-year contract, which was with Dynegy and had a fixed electric supply rate of \$0.06787/kWh.

To assist Woodhaven Owners in assessing these programs, the Association monitors the electric supply rates, and the following chart provides information on the comparative rates experienced this summer. Updated information is provided twice per year, in the spring / early summer and at this time.

Some additional information for Owners to consider:

- The Lee County municipal rate with AEP is fixed and remains in effect through July 2023.
- Com Ed's billing system for supply rates includes a line item called Purchase Electricity Adjustment or PEA. This item can be listed as a credit or as a charge and has a cap of \$0.005/kWh in either direction.
- Com Ed's current base rate is \$0.06776/kWh and can range from \$0.06276/kWh to \$0.07276/kWh depending on the PEA charge each month. Com Ed's base rate is adjusted two to three times each year, so it will change throughout the aggregation period.
- Owners can opt out of the Lee County aggregation program at any time without penalty. When this occurs, the Owner can choose another supplier or Com Ed as their supplier. If Com Ed is the chosen supplier, the Owner will be committed to a 6-month contract. At the end of the 6 months the owner will have the option of opting into another agreement, including the aggregation agreement.

Each Owner's electric bill includes three separate sections titled Electric Supply Services, Delivery Services, and Taxes & Other expenses. The information provided above addresses the Electric Supply Service portion of this bill. The Delivery Service portion of the bill is not subject to municipal aggregation, is provided by Com Ed, and is regulated by the Illinois Commerce Commission.

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Miscellaneous Items

- The General Store's final day of operation for 2021 is Sunday, October 24th. This facility will re-open in early April 2022. The laundromat is open 24/7 throughout the year.
- With regard to storm related and forestry projects, we were able to accomplish our objectives prior to Labor Day Weekend. Work continues on the improved trails, roadsides, and common areas to address damaged trees and widow makers throughout the park. Work on the natural / grass hiking trails has been limited to moving debris to keep the trails open with clean-up planned as a winter project.
- Comfort Station #4 improvements continued this fall as planned improvements should be completed over the next several weeks.
- Road patching improvements will take place in the second half of October with repairs targeted to address utility digs and culvert replacements throughout the property.
- As of September 27th, 237 oak trees had been identified to have oak wilt and were removed or scheduled to be removed.
- The fall leaf vacuum program begins on November 1, 2021 and runs through the month ending on November 30, 2021. Please remember to sign up for this service with sign up sheets available at the Association Office, Front Gate, and Service Center. This is also a link provided on the Woodhaven App in the main menu list for Brush Pickup.
- The Aquatic Operations Referendum Committee has completed their assessment of the project and is recommending the matter be presented to the Membership for a referendum vote next year. More information on this project will be prepared and presented for your review beginning with next month's issue of the Woodhaven News.

The fall season is an excellent time of the year to enjoy your property. We hope all of you have the opportunity to take advantage of the activities and natural beauty that is provided at Woodhaven Lakes. Enjoy the remainder of 2021 and thank you for an enjoyable and rewarding 50th summer season!

I cannot believe how quickly this past season passed by! Is it a sign of getting older or that there was so much to do in keeping up with the lakes. It must be a combination of both.

It was a struggle at times, but the lakes fared well despite the weather conditions. The aquatic weed harvester was kept busy through most of the season with most of the work having been done on Bass Lake throughout the early part of the season. In addition, many chemical treatments were made in conjunction with the harvesting. It seems each year is an extreme of weather conditions either too wet or dry as was experienced this year. I am hopeful next season will be a 'normal' one.

I want to make note of an observation made while out on Bass Lake recently. With the lowered water levels on the lakes, it was noted that there are a number of seawalls that have fallen in disrepair. For these structures to be effective, they must be kept in sound condition. In addition, it is advisable for many to place some stone on the lake side of the seawall at the "toe" to discourage muskrats from burrowing under the wall. As some of you may know, these critters can wreak a lot of havoc once they get entrenched. The Association resource staff conducts trapping of muskrat and beaver during the designated state trapping season with the goal of reducing the populations. If you noted activity in your area during the season, please contact me. This lowered water period would be a good time to take advantage of making repairs to your seawalls. Be sure to check with ESAC regarding necessary permits.

We are continuing to work towards establishing a deer management program. As with many things these past few years, the pandemic has held this up to a degree. Plans are to have a presentation in the coming future to provide opportunity for Property Owners to learn more regarding deer management. The important part of moving forward with a deer management program is that constituents are in agreement with the reasons for a program. There are a number of homeowner associations in northern Illinois that have implemented these programs on their properties with great success. When left unchecked, wildlife populations can become problematic. Take the Canada goose population management program which we have been doing for 16 years. We all enjoy seeing these wild animals while out in nature but there comes a point when the deer population in an area becomes over abundant, causing problems with the ecology of the area, potential for disease to enter in, and deer-vehicle collisions. With the

deer population, chronic wasting disease (CWD) has become a widespread problem. CWD has been in Illinois since 2002 beginning in northern Illinois. Since then the disease has continued to spread south with the first positive animal being identified in Lee county. I believe it is important to continue moving forward with a deer management plan. Several Property Owners have come to me expressing concerns with our deer herd indicating their frustrations with maintaining their landscapes over the years only to have the deer eat the plants, trees and shrubs.

On another note, we are moving forward with an erosion control project scheduled to take place over the next 3-4 years in the stream (Fig.1) that runs down to Bass Lake between sections 8 & 9. The project is in the final engineering and permitting phase at this time. The goal of this project is to significantly reduce the amount of sediment being carried to the lake by stabilizing the stream banks and bed in this stretch. This work will be conducted in the late summer/fall when conditions will be most conducive for construction equipment to work in this area. I would like to make adjoining Property Owners aware of this as the work will be intensive, but the end product will be a healthier corridor leading to Bass Lake. The intent during the project will be to preserve as much of the existing vegetation that acts as a "privacy" barrier as possible. Any areas disturbed will be re-vegetated to help give this area more interest and provide habitat for wildlife.

One other bit of information I would like to explain. The "green stuff" that has been blowing around on the surface of Sunset Lake the past couple months is a very small, floating plant by the name of watermeal (Fig.2). It is not toxic and does not cause problems with fishing or boating as it does not foul your lines, lures or boat props. Watermeal is more of an aesthetic nuisance depending on how you view it. It is difficult to treat once the plant gets to the proportions seen on Sunset Lake. The unusually warm weather we have been experiencing helps to keep it multiplying. The plant is not harmful to fish or other aquatic life. It can actually provide cover for fish species seeking to get out of the sun or to lay in ambush of prey. As colder temperatures begin to prevail, the plant will die and sink to the bottom of the lake to decay.

As a reminder, the Bait Shop will close for the season at the end of October. The bait machine will remain in operation throughout the winter months for your convenience.

Enjoy the fall season!

REMINDER: Loose-Leaf Pickup Begins November 1 and Ends November 30!

Rake leaves, grass clippings, pine needles, and other leafy materials to the front of your lot along the road in a windrow. A windrow is when the pile of leaves is strung out along an area in a row. Leaf piles should be within 5 feet of the roadway but not blocking or obstructing traffic so that the vacuum tube is able to reach the pile effectively. The vacuum has limited reach.

Paper bag pickup will run through October 31 while brush pick up continues each week through November 30.

The leaf vacuum is designed to pick up leafy materials so do not incorporate sticks, rocks, soil and trash into the piles to be vacuumed.



Piles with these types of material will not be picked up. When attempting to pick this foreign material up with the leaf vacuum, time is lost due to frequent clogging in the hose and/or damage to the unit. Piles not picked up will be the responsibility of the owner/contractor to dispose of and/or separate any debris in the piles.

Landscape material is not allowed to be put in or around the dumpsters around property so please utilize the landscape pickup service.

Property Owners wanting to utilize this service are instructed to sign up at the True Value Store, Administration Receptionist Desk, General Store, Gate, or the app. We ask that information written down be legible since it must be transferred to another worksheet that is given to the vacuum operators.

The procedure for lot-to-lot pickup is as follows:

1. Lists are picked up on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday of each week during the pickup period.
2. Each list is compiled and given to the vacuum operator.
3. The vacuum operators finish the current list before moving on to the next.

The above procedure is the fairest most practical method to those requesting this service. Be aware that the vacuum fills up, requiring a trip to the composting area behind the True Value store. Your leaves will get picked up as long as you signed up for the service. On occasion, due to human error in the transfer of information, lots are inadvertently missed. Please contact the Resource Department.

Make Plans to Remove Your Boat from Lake Storage and Common Areas by December 1st.

This is a reminder to pick up your boats from the lake storage areas, as well as any common areas around the lakes, prior to December 1. Boats stored at the designated boat storage areas or any common area must be removed between December 1 and March 1. By doing so, those boats that are abandoned can be identified and steps can be taken to locate the owner. In addition, routine maintenance can be performed to the storage areas. This is also a good time for watercraft owners to make sure that the registration sticker is current and the section/lot numbers are affixed to the outside of the boat. Watercrafts utilizing an electric motor for propulsion are required to register their watercraft with the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. Staff will pick up remaining boats after December 1. There was an unusually





high number of watercraft left at the storage areas in 2020. Notification letters will be sent out to the owners of boats as long as the section/lot number appears on the outside of the boat. To reclaim a boat picked up by staff, the owner will be required to pay required fees for pickup and storage as well as provide proof of ownership. Any boats not claimed will be auctioned off after a period of one year. Please take time this fall to pick up your boats from all common areas. LANDSCAPE WASTE LOT-to-LOT PICKUP PROCEDURE

Snowmobile Trail Guide

Section 11. Snowmobiles (4/17)

- A. A minimum of 4" of snow is required to open the snowmobile trails.
- B. Snowmobile usage shall be limited to those areas designated for their use by the Association.
- C. Operation of snowmobiles shall, at all times, be in compliance with those laws set forth by the state of Illinois and the Association's Rules and Regulations as listed in Article II.
 - 1. Snowmobile operation is not allowed on any lake or pond.
 - 2. Hours of operation:
 - » Monday-Thursday: 7:00 a.m. to Midnight
 - » Friday-Sunday: 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.
 - » Holidays: 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.
 - » Entering property by snowmobile after the set times the trails are closed is permitted for the sole purpose of traveling to the Owner's Campsite.
- D. Snowmobile operators are allowed to use roadways only for the purpose of going to trail areas and entering/exiting property.
- E. Management reserves the right to close any trail or area due to hazardous conditions.

Snow & Ice Control Procedures


- The decision to plow snow and/or apply ice control materials to Woodhaven's roads will be made by Maintenance Department personnel and will be based on a variety of factors including: forecasted depth of snow and temperatures, time of day, and scheduled activities and events.
- When blinding conditions exist, all equipment will be pulled off the roads until it is safe to operate.
- Woodhaven Drive East and West, Greenbriar Trail, Mayfair Trail, and Cranhurst Trail are priority roads. These roads are plowed and/or spread with chips in their entirety first. Secondary roads and cul-de-sacs are plowed only after the priority roads are tended.
- Specific problem areas will be handled as soon as possible after the Maintenance Department has been notified. Emergencies should be directed to the Main Gate by calling 815-849-5915.
- Property Owners are required to remove vehicles completely from the road at all times during the snow removal process. Citations will be issued to violators.
- Plows may make several passes in order to widen the roads. "Windrows" are unavoidable.
- Plows will not be lifted at any entrance to individual driveways.
- Maintenance personnel are prohibited from plowing private driveways; clearance of driveway entrances is the responsibility of the Campsite owner.
- Association personnel are prohibited from using Woodhaven vehicles for the purpose of pulling or towing owners or guest's vehicles.







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

Let's talk turkey! Many people eat turkey for Thanksgiving time holidays, but why turkey? By the turn of the 19th century, turkey had become a popular dish for many occasions. One reason was because they were so plentiful; another reason was because many family farms raised them. However, the wild turkey was not always so plentiful. In fact this wild turkey became an endangered, almost extinct, species in Illinois by the early 1900s when pioneer populations were increasing dramatically throughout the state. In 1959, Illinois began a reintroduction program for the wild turkey, trapping them in Southern states and releasing them into southern Illinois. Thanks to this program, we can find turkeys throughout the state today and even right here in Woodhaven!



The month of October gave us beautiful weather for Fall Fest Weekend! We enjoyed seeing a number of you at the Nature Center to enjoy our mini wood block pumpkins craft, milkweed seeds, and nature in general. We enjoyed an entertaining game of Nature Pictionary with some fun and unique drawings! We hope you all enjoyed the end of season bash!

The Nature Center is now closed for the season, but we look forward to seeing you for Cabin Fever! As we move into the winter season, Nature Center staff will be working on creating new programs, displays and exhibits for the 2022 season. Are there any nature topics you would like to learn about at the Nature Center? Please let us know your ideas for new displays, programs, and more!

New in Nature: Phenology is the study of the timing of biological phenomena in nature! To learn more about phenology, revisit this article in the March *Woodhaven News*. Your family and you can track phenology in your own backyard by starting a nature journal. Keep track of what you see and when, or use a calendar to write your observations in.

November, the end of fall migration and continuation of hibernation for some animals. We will see many more cranes, ducks and geese that are coming through the area and spending the winter in nearby open wetlands and fields. By this time, our smaller mammals should be hibernating, including ground squirrels, rabbits, groundhogs, and other rodents. The first frost dates may happen in October or early November; the average around Woodhaven is October 3rd. This is when the temperatures will dip below freezing, resulting in frost on the ground. Frost dates are important to know

because as the temperatures drop, certain plants cannot survive as well. A "light" freeze (29-32°F) will hurt delicate plants. A "moderate" freeze (25-28°F) will damage most garden plants, and a "severe" freeze (24°F or lower) is almost always fatal to all garden plants or house plants. Will there be snow this November? Chances are good since in the last 100+ years, only 4 years have a record of no snow in November!

During the month of September, we saw a large number and variety of smaller bird species heading south, including the warblers, vireos, and kinglets. The Monarch butterfly population was on the move and a number of them were found in Southern Illinois and Missouri near the end of the month. The goldenrods and asters were in full bloom in the prairies and into early October. Autumnal Equinox arrived on September 22nd, marking the official first day of fall! Mosquitos finally started to disappear as the temps cooled down over night. The white-tailed bucks that are around the area started to rub the "velvet" off their antlers in preparation for rut. A few trees started to change colors, but mostly sumac shrubs at this point.

Head outside and enjoy the trails around the area to see what may happen this November in nature! If you see something awesome, stop by the Nature Center and let us know, or bring in a picture to add to our photo wall!
