

#### resident's letter

#### You've got mail!!!

Well, not mail...but packages! You've got deliveries and a lot of them at Woodhaven. In today's world we do the majority of our purchases online, making it easy to purchase. Then there's the delivery...and that's where Woodhaven needs your help. I would like to share some

tips, so deliveries can be smoother for both you and the Association staff. In providing the 509 LaMoille Road, Sublette Illinois address, the package will be delivered to the Administration Office. The office has limited space and many times, especially during season, delivered packages created a major space issue; the size and sheer volume of packages we are receiving is increasing.

- **Timely pickup** in past times we used to put delivery notices on the front gate window. Now that is not feasible, given the volume of deliveries, not to mention causing Owners to stop at the gate to read the extensive list, holding up the line. The office does not notify the Property Owner of the delivery. It is the responsibility of the Property Owner to keep track of their delivery through their delivery service. Once we receive the delivery at the office, we log it into our records that it has been received. And yes, if it sits at the office for a long period of time we do try and contact the Property Owner. This sometimes is difficult, also, if an Owner has not updated their current phone number with us.
- **Detailed recipient information** when providing the shipping information, when asked who it should be sent to please provide the Property Owner name and section and lot number. In many cases we do not get the primary lot owner or the section and lot number requiring staff to look it up. As noted above staff logs in each item that is delivered, which is time consuming. During season we can receive as many as 80 packages or more a day.
- Oversized packages as mentioned earlier, Owners are now typically purchasing online and that means larger items like lawn furniture, satellite dishes, firepit tabletops, large garden umbrellas, etc...and they have it delivered to the office. The administration office is not set up as a warehouse, making it a challenge when we receive oversized packages. At times it has created a hazard by potentially blocking doorways and hallways requiring staff to stack and move items constantly through the day. Some items are so large and heavy, it's a safety issue for staff to even move it. Such large items should be arranged through your vendor where you coordinate with them to enter the gate with your pass and escort them to your site, not delivered to the office.

I share this with you to build an awareness that as a Property Owner we need your help and consideration when having items sent to Woodhaven. Woodhaven accepts these items as a courtesy, however it is the Property Owner's responsibility to ensure the timely pickup of their purchase. As a fellow Property Owner and as a "snowbird" I appreciate that Woodhaven provides this courtesy and I would like to thank you for your cooperation in advance.

#### **Budget Process Begins**

For Woodhaven's management and staff, the next several months are devoted to preparing and presenting the Association's 2022-2023 annual budget. We will work closely with the Finance and Facilities Planning Committees to prepare a preliminary budget for presentation to the Property Owners and ultimately to the Board of Directors for final approval. The Facilities Planning Committee recently completed its review of projects to be considered next year, and the Finance Committee will complete its initial review of the operating budget on September 18th.

Current year projections and several years of actual history are used to establish a preliminary operating budget for review and discussion. Major repair, renovation, replacement, and possible new projects are evaluated within our reserve plan with approved changes incorporated into the planning process. Several workshops and related meetings will be held to refine the budget and prepare it for presentation to the membership at the Budget Hearing scheduled for Saturday, November 13th at Woodhaven's Rec Plex. Following the hearing, additional adjustments will be made to refine the budget and finalize assessment levels for FY 2022-

Based on experiences in the last couple years, we recognize and anticipate operations may be impacted by outside influences and will continue to work through

these issues to establish clarity in achieving our objectives. We have successfully navigated through these uncertainties, and it is our goal to continue meeting and exceeding expectations. As the budget process progresses, we will keep Owners updated in future issues of the *Woodhaven News*.

On September 14th, the Board of Directors reviewed objectives for the 2022-2023 Budget Process, which will be based on the following topics and

- » Department managers will prepare their respective budget information on a general objective of maintaining and/or enhancing services.
- » Exceptions to "maintaining service levels" will be identified and noted for discussion during the budget process.
- » Assessment levels are scheduled to remain the same for FY 2022-2023, \$1,360 on lots with sewer services and \$1,235 on lots without sewer services. An increase in assessments is projected for FY 2023-2024 to \$1,475 and \$1,350 respectively and remain at these levels for FY 2024-2025 and 2025-2026.
- » Consideration and redistribution of the FY 2020-2021 surplus results totaling \$966,649 will be included in this process. The majority of this surplus occurred for federal subsidized programs including the Pay-



- » Recreation plans are to find a modified normal in funding for events and programming.
- » Intend to increase maintenance and resource department staffing and continue development of our succession planning throughout the orga-
- » Review garbage contract and services, considering increases in capacities for garbage and recycling programs, and making improvements to the unacceptable material compound.
- » Review burning program and consider improvements to reduce and/ or eliminate impact on neighboring properties.
- » Continue with network / software improvements with FY 2022-2023 funding focused on upgrading our memberships data base services.
- » The restricted fund objective continues to focus on maintaining a longrange plan that provides funding for current and future projects while also maintaining adequate reserves. Adequate reserves are measured by combining a cash flow analysis with percent funded objectives targeted at keeping balances above 30% funded levels.

#### **White-Tail Deer Management**

The white-tailed deer is a common sighting for Property Owners and guests in and around Woodhaven. I believe the white-tail deer is actually a common sighting throughout the state wherever one travels. In 2019, deer numbers throughout Illinois were estimated at 670,000 with an estimated population in the United States of 30 million! The white-tail deer is abundant. What happens

when there are too many deer on the landscape?

When deer populations become too high, natural landscapes can be negatively impacted. Deer can over browse the existing plants and young trees to the point where the overall ecological health of a given area declines. Seed-



ling trees are browsed off thus reducing the number of understory tree survival. In a healthy ecosystem, these understory trees over time replace older, declining and dead trees. Reduction in the understory trees changes the plant structure that normally makes up the plant community. Native plants are replaced by invasive species such as garlic mustard and oriental bittersweet. These two species further degrade the existing plant community as they out compete them.

In addition to natural areas, landscape plantings around homes in communities become targets for deer. Deer browse on all species of plants, trees and shrubs granted they are species they find palatable. Landscape plantings can be decimated by deer at certain times of the vear. Homeowner's vegetable gardens are often targeted by deer when unprotected. Trees, especially young ones, are

browsed and during the early fall bucks rub the trees to remove the shedding velvet from their newly grown antlers. Trees up to 6 inches in diameter can be stripped of their bark thus causing the tree to weaken and/or die.

Tick borne diseases become more prevalent with increased deer numbers. Lyme disease has been increasing in the state of Illinois. Some of the

research indicates that high numbers of deer in an area increases the incidence of Lyme disease.

Deer vehicle collisions increase when deer populations are high. According to State Farm, U.S. drivers on average have a 1 in 116 chance of colliding with an animal. The large majority of these collisions are with deer. There

were 1.5 million animal collision insurance claims in the U.S. between July 2019 and June 2020. In Illinois, the chance of hitting an animal is 1 in 148. This leads to deaths, injuries, and vehicle repair expenses.

Too many deer can be detrimental to the health of the deer population in an area. As deer numbers increase, there is an increased pressure on the food resources to sustain healthy animals. All environments in which deer live have what is called a "carrying capacity."



Carrying capacity for deer, simply put, is the number of animals that a given area of land can support. For the white-tailed deer, a healthy number of animals on average is 20 deer per square mile. Exceeding the carrying capacity can lead to malnutrition in animals.

Transmission of disease increases in an area when deer numbers are high. The disease that continues to increase in the Midwest is Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD). States have been dealing with this disease affecting the deer populations for a number of years with limited success. There is no cure for the disease at this time. When deer contract CWD, it is always fatal. This disease was first identified in Colorado and Wyoming in the 1960s and 70s. Since then it has spread to affect animals across the U.S. in 24 states as well as 3 provinces in Canada. Where the disease is established, it is increasing in prevalence.

In Illinois, CWD was first found in 2002 in Boone County. This is in the northern part of the state near Wisconsin. The disease has since spread to infect deer in 18 counties within the state as far south as Livingston County. It has also spread to Lake, Cook and DuPage counties in the northeast part of the state. Most recently, a deer was sampled from Lee county that tested positive for the disease.



Deer generally have a "home range," where they spend the majority of their time feeding, resting, breeding and raising young. The size of the home range can vary depending on the quality of habitat but on average is around 1 square mile. During the year, deer, often males, tend to move out away from their home range. Deer that move out will generally move back to that home range in a short period of time. It is during these excursions that deer can become infected with CWD, thus spreading the disease to previously uninfected areas.

States, where CWD is occurring, are managing the disease by reducing deer populations to slow the spread. White-tail deer numbers are reduced during the designated hunting seasons each fall and early winter. The deer harvest across the state in 2020/21 was 162,500 animals. This number is up from 2019/21 which was 153,000. That may seem like a lot of deer, but compare it to the estimated population of deer across the state in 2019 which was 670,000.

Following the state hunting seasons, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) staff target deer populations in areas of high disease prevalence. In the late winter, IDNR staff attempt to reduce deer populations by enlisting sharpshooters to cull out animals in small designated areas within the counties where the disease has been identified. There were a total of

in 2020, of which 42 tested positive for CWD. Samples are also collected during the designated hunting season from animals harvested in the counties with CWD to continue monitoring the population.

The take home message in the information provided in this article is that deer populations need management to maintain the health of the herd, ecosystems and humans. Since natural predators of deer have been eliminated from most of their range. the main predator today is hunters. Hunting is the main way that the deer population is being managed. Without hunting, deer populations would go unchecked leading to more widespread disease and ecosystem degradation

#### **Fall Trout Stocking**

Plans are to stock trout into Pine, Bluegill, and Hidden lakes for fall fishing. In October, a total of 1,000 pounds of trout are to be stocked into the above mentioned lakes only. These fish will be approximately 1 pound (10-15 inches) in size. Please follow the catch limit which is set at 3 fish per day, not per lake so that all have an equal chance at catching trout. Anyone planning to keep trout will be required to have an **Illinois Fishing License** as well as an **Inland Trout Stamp**.

The season will officially open at 6:00 A.M. on the Saturday of Fall Fest weekend, October 9. The lakes that receive trout will be closed once the fish are stocked so **NO** fishing will be allowed on these lakes once the trout are released until the designated opening time. "No Fishing" signage will be posted on the lakes once the fish are stocked.

Catch and release angling for the trout is discouraged due to the fact that these fish have very low survival when handled. It would not be fair to other anglers for one person to catch trout above the limit only to have the trout die when released. An angler, with a trout stamp, not intending to keep trout can give his limit of 3 fish away. Once 3 fish are caught, you will not be able to catch any more fish for that day. Anglers are not allowed to have in possession more than 3 fish on a given day or lake. Anglers must also keep his or her fish separate from other anglers in a group.

These fish are stocked as an alternative species to pursue during the fall. winter, and spring. Trout are not intended to be an ongoing fishery as is the case with bass and bluegill species, which have sustaining populations. Trout will not reproduce in our lakes nor tolerate our summertime water temperatures. The intent is to put the trout in for Property Owners and guests to utilize for sport and food. It is hoped that all trout stocked will be utilized by the time the water temperatures reach 70 degrees the following summer. Trout are cold-water species thus they will not survive in water over 70 degrees for extended periods. By stocking these fish in the fall, it allows 3 consecutive seasons of use (fall, winter and spring).

The protocol if conditions arise which prevent the stocking for the Saturday of Fall Fest weekend; the trout will be stocked as soon as condi-

#### A Reminder to Make Plans to Remove Watercraft From All Designated Boat Storages and Common **Areas Before December 1st!**

Watercrafts are allowed on these designated storage areas from March 1 through November 30 each season. This rule applies to all common areas as well, which includes the common areas surrounding some of the lakes.

Article 5, Section 4 (F, G & H) state: F.) "All unauthorized boats shall be removed from common property, designated lake accesses and boat storage areas from December 1st to March 1st." G.) "Any boat not removed from common property will be removed by Woodhaven personnel and stored. Owners with boats that have current registration, Section and Lot number will be notified. All Owners will be required to pay a removal fee and a monthly storage fee in order to reclaim their boat. I.) "Any boats not claimed by the following June 1 may be auctioned or disposed of."

All watercraft used upon the lakes are required to have the owners section and lot number in block letters 3 inches tall affixed to the outside of the watercraft. This is important in locating the owner when a watercraft is found on a lake or shoreline. Strong winds and flash flooding tend to dislodge watercraft from a Property Owner's shoreline or designated storage area during these events. Having the section/lot number affixed to the watercraft makes notifying or returning the watercraft possible.

## Is It Time To Refresh Your Pedestal?

Woodhaven's Communications Committee is once again asking for each individual Property Owner's help. Please take a few minutes to check the numbers on your pedestal to ensure they are affixed to the pedestal; they are legible (from the road, if possible); and they are the correct identifying numbers. Many pedestals are located in areas on lots where numbers may not be seem from the road; however, it is still important for emergency responders walking the property to know they can still find a Section and Lot on the electric pedestal for easy identification. Most pedestals also only have lot numbers, adding your section number to the pedestal is a great help! For a nominal cost to each Property Owner, replacing the Section and Lot numbers on each property's electric pedestals can go a long way in greatly improving emergency efforts and efficiency in future situations. Woody's True Value has both 2" and 3" vinyl reflective numbers available for around \$1 each.

## **Local Highlights: The Nachusa Grasslands**

While Woodhaven is a perfect escape for us, our "happy place," our "paradise," sometimes even "workhaven," the surrounding areas have so much to offer! The Communications Committee would like to help highlight some fun local attractions to help Owners encounter some hidden gems in the area. The first local highlight we'll check out is the Nachusa Grasslands, where 90-130 American Bison currently reside.

The Grasslands themselves are a remnant prairie, woodland, and wetland area where a not-forprofit organization called the "Friends of Nachusa Grasslands" works to restore the grasslands area by protecting the native grasses, flowers, insects, and animals. The bison herd began as a small herd of 30 bison in 2014, through great care, but minimal interference, the herd has grown to the larger numbers seen today.

The bison at the grasslands roam over 1,500 acres of land; while you can potentially view them from the Visitor Center, sometimes they are more difficult to see, so binoculars are recommended. Sometimes you get really lucky and can watch the herd travel through the tunnel under Stone Barn Road to the North or South end of the area. Some of the best view points, aside from the Visitor Center, are on the roadsides surrounding the grasslands.



The Visitor Center is a great experience in itself – the displays show the history of the area and the work that has been done to restore the natural lands. From the Visitor Center, you can

head off into several different trailheads, offering many vantage points.

The Nachusa Grasslands offers hiking through extensive trails, both mowed lanes and off-trail options – both of which let you see the beauty of the natural surroundings, and even catch a glimpse of the bison themselves.





#### New in Nature: Phenology

Phenology is the study of the timing of bioogical phenomena in nature! To learn more about phenology, revisit this article in the March Woodhaven News. Your family and you can track phenology in your own backyard by starting a nature journal. Keep track of what you see and when, or use a calendar to write vour observations in.

October is another month of migration and the start of hibernation for some animals. We will start to see more cranes, ducks and geese as this group of birds start to migrate further

south. By this time, many of the warblers and other small birds that migrate should be through but there will still be some. We will continue to find hummingbirds hanging out as well, so make sure to offer these some tasty sugar water so they can fatten up to head south soon. Our smaller mammals like ground squirrels, rabbits, and other rodents will be hurriedly working on

finding food to stock up on for the winter and fattening themselves up to make it through the cold wintertime. Have you ever wondered how squirrels find all of those nuts that they've buried? They use a variety of techniques to get them back, including sense of smell, memory, and chance! Many squirrels will store the nuts in the same place every year and remember where that spot is. Then they use their sense of smell to go back to that area and sniff around looking for that nutty smell. Sometimes they miss a few



but that just helps the forest grow for future generations. Frogs, snakes, and lizards are also starting to move and hibernate for the winter since they don't like the cold weather. October also brings the first frost which kills off mosquitos and stops the crickets and grasshoppers from calling.

During the month of August, our population of Monarch butterflies increased dramatically. We saw the summer heat and humidity continue along with the sound of cicadas and katydids singing all around us. By the end of August, we started to see the fall prairie colors showing; including the purples of New England aster and blazing star, the golds of the goldenrods, and the rusty browns of the grasses like big bluestem, little bluestem, and Indian grass. The shorebirds that started to migrate at the end of July, really made a move in August with new species showing up throughout Illinois at various wet, mucky areas. Some early warblers like the golden-winged and black-throated blue warblers started to come into the area at the end of August. Another major migrator was the fast flying nighthawks. While they have the name "hawk" in the name, they are not related to hawks. They are a bird that is related to the Whippoorwill and will come out as dusk hunting for bugs like dragonflies to eat. Usually you can hear this bird first before finding them as they make a loud, electric "peent" call. They are easy to identify when they fly by as they have long pointed wings that have white bars on the wings. They are migrating at the end of the month on one of the longest migration routes for a North American bird; migrating from 2,500 to 6,800



miles from parts of Canada and the northern US to central/southern South America.

Head outside and enjoy the trails around the area to see what may happen this October in nature! If vou see something awesome, stop by the nature center and let us know or bring in a picture to add to our photo wall!




