Lee County Delinquent Taxes

Woodhaven lot owners are responsible for paying a real estate tax bill to the Lee County Treasurer each year. This year, real estate taxes bills were due on June 26, 2020 and the second installment on September 2, 2020. We recently received information from the Lee County Treasurer's Office on the number of Woodhaven properties who are delinquent in taxes this year. This number, totaling approximately 800 properties is consistent with previous year totals at this time and we expect many of the balances to be paid prior to October 28th sale date. If you have not paid, or are not sure if you paid your real estate taxes, please contact the Lee County Treasurer's Office at (815) 288-4477 at your earliest convenience to make you do not incur additional expenses .



Any unpaid taxes will be offered for sale on Wednesday, October 28th at the Old Court House Building beginning at 9:00 a.m. At that time, delinquent fees and charges will be added to the unpaid balance of any delinquent property in Lee County. Again, if you have doubts about the status of your Woodhaven property tax bill, please do not hesitate in calling the Lee County Treasurers' Office.



Association staff members will attend the tax sale to observe these activities and evaluate if there are any changes with the number of properties delinquent in real estate taxes this year.

Budget Update

The 2021-2022 budget process is in full swing as the Association's Finance Committee, Facilities Planning Committee and Board of Directors held several meetings to establish an assessment plan supporting our current and long-term objectives. On October 2nd and October 3rd, budget workshops were held allowing Board and Committee members to meet with department managers and review specific information on the Association's operating activities, capital projects, debt financing plans and future reserve funding plans. Additional meetings have and will take place in October and early November to further define our budget and prepare it for presentation to the Membership at the November 14th Budget Hearing. This hearing will take place at 1:00 p.m. at the Association's Rec Plex Multi-Purpose Room.

The Budget Hearing provides Property Owners an opportunity to make comments, suggestions and request more information on the Association's budget. A copy of the Budget Hearing Packet will be published in the next issue of the *Woodhaven News* for Owner review and comments. The presentation includes the recommended assessments along with an updated long-term assessment plan. All Owners are encouraged to attend the annual budget hearing and participate in this process.

Following the hearing, information received will be evaluated by each Committee and a final assessment recommendation will be made and presented to the Board of Directors for approval at their December Board Meeting. The Board of Directors will be holding meetings on Tuesday, November 17th and Tuesday, December 8th at the NIU Conference Center located in Naperville. Each meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m. and will provide Owners with additional opportunities to present comments and ask questions about the Association's budget. Approval of the 2021-2022 assessments, including specific fund allocations, will be placed on the December 8, 2020 Board Meeting Agenda.

The following charts provide information on the proposed assessments for 2021-2022. The highlighted sections show what the projected assessments were at the beginning of the budget process, and the amended allocations are shown in the adjacent column. The current recommendation is for assessments to remain at \$1,360 on lots with sewer services and \$1,235 on lots without sewer services. The long-range plans are projecting assessments to also remain at these levels for the following year, FY 2022-2023.

Electric Aggregation Information

Earlier this year, Woodhaven Property Owners and other landowners located in the unincorporated areas of Lee County received a municipal aggregation letter proposing fixed electric supply services in Lee County. Depending on whether you participated in the prior aggregation agreement, each owner received one of two letters outlining the details of a 3-year aggregation program with AEP beginning in August 2020. The AEP program provides a fixed rate of \$0.05634/kWh for energy supply rates at fixed rate for 3 years. This program replaces the prior aggregation agreement, which was with Dynegy at fixed rate of \$0.06787/kWh from August 2017 – July 2020.

To assist Woodhaven Owners in assessing these programs, the Association monitors the electric supply rates and the following chart provides information on the comparative rates experienced this summer. Updated information is provided twice per year, in the spring / early summer and at this time.

Some additional information for Owners to consider:

- The Lee County municipal rate with AEP is fixed and remains in effect through July 2023.
- Com Ed’s billing system for supply rates includes a line item called Purchase Electricity Adjustment or PEA. This item can be listed as a credit or as a charge and has a cap of \$0.005/kWh in either direction.
- Com Ed’s current base rate is \$0.06473/kWh and can range from \$0.05973/kWh to \$0.06973/kWh depending on the PEA charge each month. Com Ed’s base rate is adjusted two to three times each year, so it will change throughout the aggregation period.
- Owners can opt out of the Lee County aggregation program at any time without penalty. When this occurs, the Owner can choose another supplier or Com Ed as their supplier. If Com Ed is the chosen supplier, the Owner will be committed to a 6-month contract. At the end of the 6 months the owner will have the option of opting into another agreement, including the aggregation agreement.

Each Owner’s electric bill includes three separate sections titled Electric Supply Services, Delivery Services, and Taxes & Other expenses. The information provided above addresses the Electric Supply Service portion of this bill. The Delivery Service portion of the bill is not subject to municipal aggregation, is provided by Com Ed, and is regulated by the Illinois Commerce Commission.

General Store Operations

The General Store operations will close for the winter months on Sunday, October 25, 2020 and will remain closed until early April 2021. We would like to thank everyone for their cooperation and patience this year as we worked through the restrictions and limitations put in place for Covid-19. Like everyone, we are hoping we will be able to proceed next year without any material limitations.

Projects

Your management and staff will be working on the number of projects as we enter the fall and winter seasons. Improvements are scheduled and include the following areas and projects:

- Comfort Station #4 improvements will be completed, including the ceiling, lighting, fixtures, and some exterior improvements on the gable ends of this facility.
- Installation of a pedestrian walkway bridge at the Black Oak Lake spillway.
- Deck replacement of the stage area located at the Lakeview Building.
- Road patching and repairs, including adding asphalt pads at multiple dumpster locations.
- The pump and motor for Well #1 at Water Plant will be pulled inspected and replaced.
- The trail improvement project in Section 23 along Woodhaven Lake will be completed.
- Lot improvements are planned on 4 lots owned by the Association in Section 11, lots 11-100, 11-101, 11-102, and 11-103.

The fall season is an excellent time of the year to enjoy your property. We hope all of you have the opportunity to take advantage of the activities and natural beauty that is provided at Woodhaven Lakes. Enjoy the remainder of 2020 and thank you for an enjoyable and rewarding summer season!

1. Motion was made to approve the August 23, 2020 – Board of Directors’ Meeting Minutes. Motion passed unanimously.
2. Added under New Business, item 1. Section 5 Lot 276 Board Discussion on ESAC Citation.

Section 11. Snowmobiles (4/17)

- A. A minimum of 4" of snow is required to open the snowmobile trails.
- B. Snowmobile usage shall be limited to those areas designated for their use by the Association.
- C. Operation of snowmobiles shall, at all times, be in compliance with those laws set forth by the state of Illinois and the Association's Rules and Regulations as listed in Article II.
 1. Snowmobile operation is not allowed on any lake or pond.
 2. Hours of operation:
 - » Monday-Thursday: 7:00 a.m. to Midnight
 - » Friday-Sunday: 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.
 - » Holidays: 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.
 - » Entering property by snowmobile after the set times the trails are closed is permitted for the sole purpose of traveling to the Owner's Campsite.
- D. Snowmobile operators are allowed to use roadways only for the purpose of going to trail areas and entering/exiting property.
- E. Management reserves the right to close any trail or area due to hazardous conditions.

Snow & Ice Control Procedures

- The decision to plow snow and/or apply ice control materials to Woodhaven's roads will be made by Maintenance Department personnel and will be based on a variety of factors including: forecasted depth of snow and temperatures, time of day, and scheduled activities and events.
- When blinding conditions exist, all equipment will be pulled off the roads until it is safe to operate.
- Woodhaven Drive East and West, Greenbriar Trail, Mayfair Trail, and Cranhurst Trail are priority roads. These roads are plowed and/or spread with chips in their entirety first. Secondary roads and cul-de-sacs are plowed only after the priority roads are tended.
- Specific problem areas will be handled as soon as possible after the Maintenance Department has been notified. Emergencies should be directed to the Main Gate by calling 815-849-5915.
- Property Owners are required to remove vehicles completely from the road at all times during the snow removal process. Citations will be issued to violators.
- Plows may make several passes in order to widen the roads. "Windrows" are unavoidable.
- Plows will not be lifted at any entrance to individual driveways.
- Maintenance personnel are prohibited from plowing private driveways; clearance of driveway entrances is the responsibility of the Campsite owner.
- Association personnel are prohibited from using Woodhaven vehicles for the purpose of pulling or towing owners or guest's vehicles.

Loose-leaf pickup season begins November 1 and will run through November 30.

Rake leaves, grass clippings, pine needles, and other leafy materials to the front of your lot along the road in a windrow. A windrow is when the pile of leaves is strung out along an area in a row. Leaf piles should be within 5 feet of the roadway but not blocking or obstructing traffic so that the vacuum tube is able to reach the pile effectively. The vacuum has limited reach.

Paper bag pickup will run through October 31 while brush pick up continues each week through November 30.

The leaf vacuum is designed to pick up leafy materials so do not incorporate sticks, rocks, soil and trash into the piles to be vacuumed.

Piles with these types of material will not be picked up. When attempting to pick this foreign material up with the leaf vacuum, time is lost due to frequent clogging in the hose and/or damage to the unit. Piles not picked up will be the responsibility of the Owner/contractor to dispose of and/or separate any debris in the piles.



Landscape material is not allowed to be put in or around the dumpsters around property, so please utilize the landscape pickup service.

Property Owners wanting to utilize this service are instructed to sign up at one of 4 locations on property. This is the same procedure used in all landscape waste pick up. The sign-up sheets are located at the True Value Store, Administration Receptionist Desk, General Store, and Gate. We ask that information written down be legible since it must be transferred to another worksheet that is given to the vacuum operators.

The procedure for lot-to-lot pickup is as follows:

1. Lists are picked up on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday of each week during the pickup period.
2. Each list is compiled and given to the vacuum operator.
3. The vacuum operators finish the current list before moving on to the next.

The above procedure is the fairest most practical method to those requesting this service. Be aware that the vacuum fills up thus requiring a trip to the composting area behind the True Value store. Your leaves will get picked up as long as you signed up for the service. On occasion, due to human error in the transfer of information, lots are inadvertently missed. Please contact the Resource Department.

Make Plans to Remove Your Boat from Lake Storage and Common Areas



This is a reminder to pick up your boats from the lake storage areas as well as any common areas around the lakes prior to December 1. Boats stored at the designated boat storage areas or any common area must be removed between December 1 and March 1. By doing so, those boats that are abandoned can be identified and steps can be taken to locate the owner. In addition, routine maintenance can be performed to the storage areas.

This is also a good time for watercraft owners to make sure that the registration sticker is current and the section/lot numbers are affixed to the outside of the boat. Watercrafts utilizing an electric motor for propulsion are required to register their watercraft with the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. Staff will pick up remaining boats after December 1. Notification letters will be sent out to the owners of boats as long as the section/lot number appears on the outside of the boat. To reclaim a boat picked up by staff, the owner will be required to pay required fees for pickup and storage as well as provide proof of ownership. Any boats not claimed will be auctioned off after a period of one year. Please take time this fall to pick up your boats from all common areas. 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
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LANDSCAPE WASTE LOT-to-LOT PICKUP PROCEDURE







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THE naturalist CORNER

This autumn we are seeing large numbers of northern bird species moving south. Do they know something we don't? In eastern Canada, many of the trees did not have good seed crops, trees like white pine and spruce. We are seeing pine siskins, red-breasted nuthatch, and purple finch in greater numbers in Illinois this fall and some have traveled much, much further. If we have a lot of snow this winter, we may see more northern species coming this way, including snowy owls! Try taking a walk on one of the many trails around Woodhaven to watch for some of these smaller birds high in the trees, along with our local winter birds!



Moon-Month Names: For years, Native Americans and Europeans have named the months after various seasons in the Northern Hemisphere connected to the Full Moon. November is known as the "Full Beaver Moon" because Native Americans knew that this was the month when beavers finished preparations for winter and retreated into their lodges. There are other names for this month including "Deer Rutting Moon" signaling this as time for deer to go into rut; "Frost Moon," "Whitefish Moon," and "Freezing Moon." The Beaver Moon will be at its fullest on November 30, at 3:30 a.m. central time so you'll have to check it out early in the morning to see it before the sun rises!



November moons have significant history. November 6, 1966 gave us the Lunar Orbiter 2 whose mission was to photograph smooth areas of the lunar surface to help select safe landing sites for the Apollo missions. This spacecraft took photos of almost 1.6 million square miles of the Moon's surface, or almost have the size of the United States! Surveyor 6 also took photos of the moon, nearly 30,000 images and launched on November 7, 1967 for researching whether a future human mission was possible. On November 14, 1969, just a few months after the first moon landing with Apollo 11, Apollo 12 took flight with the goals of focusing on science, including investigating the lunar surface environment, collecting more than 75 pounds of samples, photographing the surface, investigating soil mechanics, collecting samples of solar wind, and retrieving parts of the robotic Surveyor 3 spacecraft that had landed previously. During this mission, the astronauts remained on the lunar surface for more than 31 hours. Garden Time: November is here so if you didn't mulch perennial beds and trees for the winter last month, you need to now. With trees, apply a thick layer of mulch in a large area around trees, making sure that the mulch does not come in contact with the trunks. Make sure to drain and store garden hoses and sprinklers, while turning off the water to any outside faucets before it freezes. Before storing your lawn mower for the season, make sure to winterize it as well and either run the gas tank empty or use an additive.



If you choose to rake the fallen leaves, try shredding them and use them for compost!



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
