

Make A Pinecone Bat



Pinecone Bat Directions

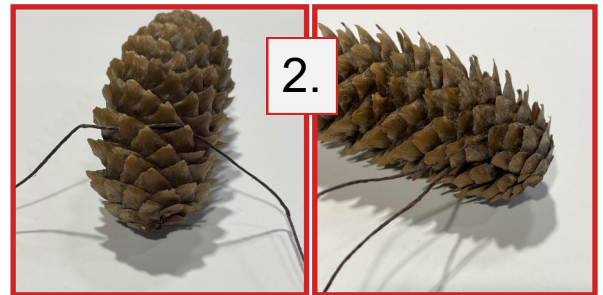
Materials: pinecone, brown construction paper with template of wings-ears-nose, piece of white paper, 2 wiggle eyes, 1 piece of string, scissors, tacky glue, black coloring pencil

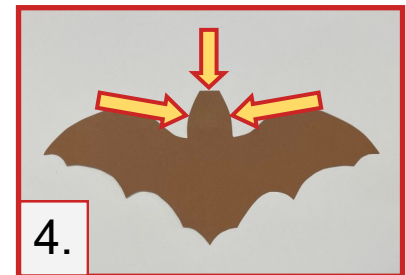
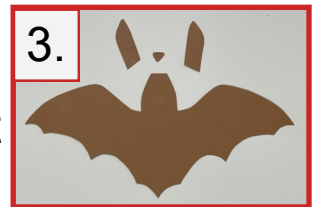
1. Start by choosing which side is the face side.

2. If you would like to hang your bat follow these steps. Tie the string near the head of the bat (the closed pointed end). Pull the string carefully through the pinecone scales and tie a couple of knots on the backside. Then tie the ends of the string together.

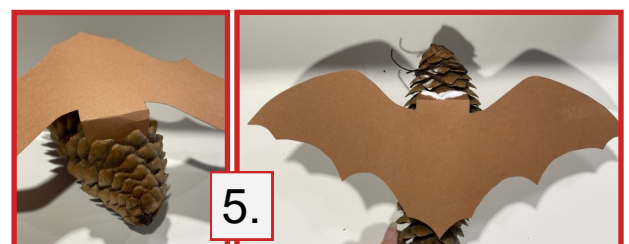


3. Cut out brown paper wings, ears, and nose.

4. Attach the wings to your pinecone. The “head” part is like a tab that will go into the scales. Figure out where you would like to attach the wings at. Depending on the size of your pinecone, you may need to cut down parts of the wings to get the “head” part to fit proper. We cut some of the top off on ours.

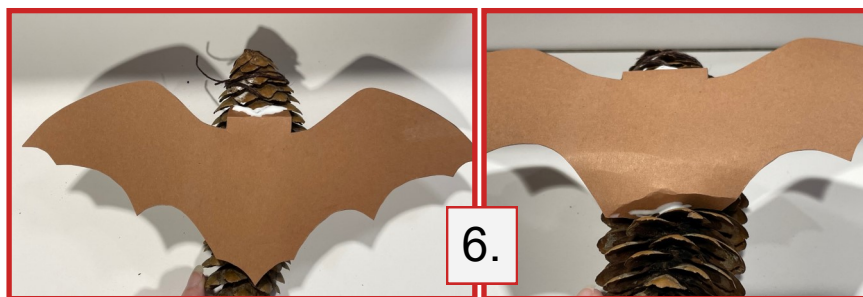


5. Glue tab into the space you want, placing glue on both sides of the tab.

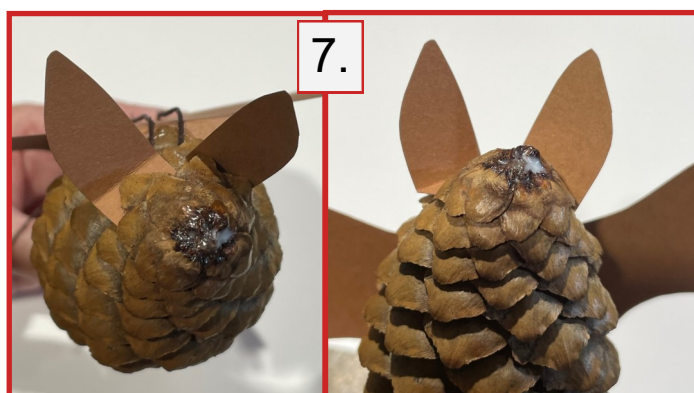


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6. At the bottom tail, you can either try gluing it straight on or tuck the tail into the scales and glue the same as the top.



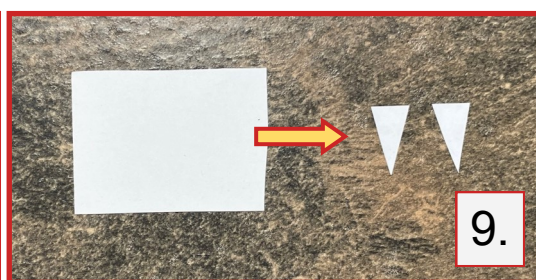
7. Add ears to the back side, either glue straight on or bend into the scales.



8. Make nostrils on nose.

9. Cut fangs out of white paper.

10. Glue the eyes, nose, and fangs near the top of the pinecone.



11. You're done! Let your bat dry a little and then let it fly at home!
