Woodhaven was built on the principles of 2025 – 2026 Assessment Levels and **Redistribution of Surplus Funds**

The Board of Directors recently approved the assessment levels at \$1,495 for lots with sewer and \$1,375 for lots without sewer for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. Invoices should be posted and sent to all Property Owners in mid-January. When you receive your assessment invoice, please review the information and balance shown on the invoice. If you have any questions, please call us at the Association Office at 815-849-5209.

You will continue to have two payment options. You can make full payment on or before March 31, 2025, to receive a \$30 discount on lots with sewer service, or a \$25 discount for lots without sewer.

You can also make three installment payments, with 50% of the assessment due on or before March 31, 2025, and second and third installment payments equal to 25% of the assessment due on or before May 31, 2025, and July 31, 2025.

The Board of Directors also approved a resolution to redistribute the entirety of operating surplus funds from Woodhaven's March 31, 2024, audited financial statement of \$93,536 to the Association's reserve fund. Work on the budget process will continue into March when the final budget schedule is approved by the Board of Directors. Staff and the Board will work on updating our five-year operating plan, and our reserve plans and prepare monthly budget projections for 2025-2026. Any changes or adjustments are subject to Committee and Board review and approval prior to presentation to the Membership. If anyone is interested in obtaining more information about the budget process, please contact the Association Office to schedule an appointment with the Executive Director.

Project Updates & Other Information

- Comfort stations open for the winter are 3, 9, 17 & 22. All others have been closed until spring.
- Leaf vacuuming and bag pick-up was completed for the season the second week of December. Bag pickup will resume in the spring on April 15, 2025.
- Cabin Fever Festival is planned for February 2, 2025.
- All the 2024 Memorial Trees and plaques have been installed.
- All the reforestation trees have been planted for the season.
- Nuisance abatement lots were completed in November. Abatable items were removed from 11 total lots including 4 park models, 3 RVs, 4 room additions, 2 sheds, 4 decks, and 1 overhead.

WHEREAS, Article VIII Section 7, of the By-laws state, wh surplus funds of more than \$100,000 are available, the Association Board of Directors will follow these limits in redistributing surplus to the Association's membership:

- a. Surplus funds identified through the annual audit proc will be held as a contingency during the summer seas immediately following the fiscal year when the surpl occurred.
- b. As part of the next budget planning process, the Board Directors will discuss options associated with redistribut surplus funds to the Association's membership. At that tin the Board of Directors may elect to distribute the funds any reasonable Association use, subject to the follow conditions:
 - 1. The decision will require a three-fourths affirmative v of the Board of Directors for approval.
 - 2. The decision must be fully disclosed to the Association membership prior to final approval.
 - 3. The decision must also comply with all federal and state requirements associated with the fiduciary care Association funds.
- c. If no other reasonable Association use of the funds is approby the Board of Directors, all of the surplus funds will distributed in the following manner:
 - 1. Approximately 30% of the surplus funds will be applied to offset future operating assessments.
 - 2. Approximately 70% of the surplus funds will be appli to pay off portions of the principal balance of the Association's long-term debt obligations.
 - 3. If the Association does not have any long-term debt obligations, approximately 70% of the surplus funds will then be allocated to the Association's restricted reserve funds. (05/10)



- The decision to plow snow and/or apply ice control materials to Woodhaven's roads will be made by Maintenance Department personnel and will be based on a variety of factors including: forecasted depth
- When blinding conditions exist, all equipment will be pulled off the roads until it is safe to operate.
- Woodhaven Drive East and West, Greenbriar Trail, Mayfair Trail, and Cranhurst Trail are priority roads. These roads are plowed and/or spread with chips in their entirety first. Secondary roads and cul-de-sacs

Their mission statement is "to collect, review and analyze data related to Woodhaven's deer population and make recommendations to the Board of Directors based on this data for the purpose of maintaining a well-balanced and healthy deer herd at Woodhaven."

- 6/15/2024 The motion was made and approved "to follow through with obtaining a Deer Population Control Permit."
- The motion was made and approved "to not wait for CWD confirmation then let the IDNR manage the situation."
- The motion was made and approved "to follow through with neighboring landOwner/hunter incentives."
- 7/20/2024 The motion was made and approved "to approve the Deer Population Control Permit recommendation to the board.". This recommendation will be presented to the Board of Directors
- 8/25/2024 The Board of Directors approved the Deer Management Committee recommendation to the board as written.
- 10/26/2024 The committee met with members from Galena Territories to discuss their deer management program and some of the hurdles they overcame for a healthy deer population.

DEER MANAGEMENT MOVING FORWARD:

Deer counts - Woodhaven staff will continue with their USDA approved route and deer counts this Fall/Winter. There are approximately 9 deer counts scheduled at this time. The counts will be added to the deer count summary chart.

CWD barrel – A barrel has been placed at the administration office front parking lot for deer to be tested for CWD.

Plant monitoring - Woodhaven staff will continue to monitor the deer exclusion structures throughout the seasons. They will continue doing a plant inventory of the structures.

Tree protection – Please refer to the rules and regulations for proper fencing and time frame it is allowed to be up.

IDNR 0 17 ILL. ADM. CODE - CH, I, SEC. 635.40 FEEDING OR BAITING OF WILDLIFE

It shall be illegal to make available food, salt, mineral blocks, or other products for ingestion by wild deer or other wildlife in areas where wild deer are present.


Woodhaven recommends bird feeders to be elevated at a minimum of 8 ft.

The Conservation Police Officer (CPO) can and will issue a citation if the above rule is not followed.

Please be aware that placing salt on driveways for any reason may result in feeding deer. This form of weed or snow control should be avoided if at all possible.

BOAT STORAGE ON LAKES:

There is no storage allowed during the months of December, January and February. All Boats left at the lakes have been removed and stored. Fees for removal are \$50 plus \$25 per month it is stored. If the boat is not claimed, it may be auctioned off.



RESOURCE NEWS General -

Refrain from placing any landscape waste in or alongside dumpsters that are located throughout property. Violation of the Rules pertaining to Trash, Debris, & Refuse is an automatic Board of Review and holds a \$150-500 fine.

DAILY CATCH LIMITS AND RULES - 2024

- Woodhaven Lake largemouth bass harvest up to 3 fish under 12 inches and "Catch & Release" on fish 12 inches and greater.
- Bass Lake largemouth bass harvest up to 3 fish under 12 inches and "Catch & 2 Release" on fish 12 inches and greater.
- 3. Pine, Sunset, Black Oak, Hidden & Bluegill lakes - 1 largemouth bass/day, 14 inch minimum length limit.
- All Lakes 15 fish combined catch limit on bluegill and redear species. 4
- 5 All lakes - 15 fish limit on crappie
- All Lakes 4 fish limit on channel catfish.
- All lakes return grass carp to the lake
- All lakes No limit on common carp, bullhead, and green sunfish species. 8
- 9. All lakes - NO MINNOWS: using live minnows can introduce unwanted species/ organisms into our lakes.
- 10. No harvesting of turtles. This is geared mainly towards snapping turtles in which populations have been declining in the State over the years due to overharvest.
- 11. 2 poles and line only in the water at a time for all the lakes on property. With this restriction, anglers would be allowed to have multiple poles but only 2 lines in the water at a given time.
- 12. No unattended fishing devices allowed at any time on any of the lakes. Unattended devices can cause mortality to fish and turtles that should be released if undersize as well as interfere with boaters using the lakes.
- 13. No trotline or jug fishing on any of the lakes. Given our fisheries are recreational, I believe these devices are damaging to our fisheries and interfere with boaters using the lakes.

A new year is upon us. That means assessment bills will soon be arriving in your mailbox. If you have received a citation at any time prior to the date the bills are printed, it will appear on your bill as a "previous year's balance." This does not necessarily mean your payment is delinquent; in fact, the citation could have been issued the day before the assessment was applied. If you have questions about when the citation was issued or what the citation is for, please contact the ESAC Office. We will be happy to clarify the issue for you.

If you have received a citation and then called for an extension to make the corrections at a later date, this does not negate the fine. The fine is applied to the account when the citation is issued. The ESAC Office does not have the authority to waive a citation once it has been issued. A citation can only be waived by the Board of Directors. It must be appealed within 30 days of the date the citation was issued by filing a request, in writing, to the Executive Director. Once the appeal is received, you will be placed on an ESAC Board of Review agenda. You must appear at the Board of Review meeting in order for the appeal to be considered.

It is not uncommon for a Property Owner to call once they receive their assessment bill and see a fine on their account for something they corrected months earlier. If you received a citation and then made the corrections required, the fine is still due on your account. Again, the fine is applied when the citation is issued and is not waived upon completion. Many Property Owners will make the needed correction, but not pay the fine.

As a reminder, the ESAC Office operates year-round. As such, letters and citations will be sent over the winter months. It is the responsibility of the Property Owner to contact our office if an extension is needed to make corrections to their property. We understand many of our Property Owners do not come to Woodhaven over the winter. We also understand that Property Owners return to Woodhaven at different times in the spring and summer. By calling our office, we can determine a date for compliance that works for the individual Property Owner, rather than arbitrarily assigning a date. Once an extension is requested, we will send a Violation Correction Agreement which notes the date for compliance. Each year, we typically send between 400-600 Correction Agreements to Property Owners to grant extensions on violations.





Nature Nuggets: Let's take a closer look at local nature!

Snow is precipitation that forms when water vapor freezes, a crystalli- 📍 zation of ice that typically forms in clouds. An ice crystal forms when the



temperature drops below 32°F and when there is the right amount of humidity in the air. It starts when water vapor condenses directly into ice without going through the liquid stage of rain. As the ice crystal falls towards Earth, it collects and freezes additional water vapor from the air, growing into a snow crystal or snow pellet.

Snow can take different forms based on the temperatures, water in the atmosphere, and other environmental changes. This includes snowflakes, snow pellets, or sleet. Snowflakes are clusters of ice crystals. Snow pellets, also known as graupel, are opaque ice particles that tend to be soft and crumbly. Sleet is made of drops of rain or drizzle that freeze into ice as they fall (sometimes called a wintery mix of rain and snow); sleet is small translucent ice balls or pellets.

Do you want to build a snowman? First, we need the perfect type of snow. Dry snow is loose powder that doesn't stick together well, and slush is too fluid to hold a shape. What you need is moist to wet snow; enough water to stick the crystals together but not too much. Look for snowstorms that come in fairly warm (a degree or two above or below freezing).

When did making a snowman come about? Snowmen have been around for centuries, dating back to the Middle Ages. The first recorded mention of a snowman-like item appears in a 1380 Book of Hours, which included drawings of snowmen in its pages. Building snowmen was a way to deal with the cold, harsh winters, and a symbol of hope for the arrival of spring. During the 19th century Victorian Era, making snowmen was a family-centered activity that became popular around the winter holidays. In the 20th century, the US saw an increase of interest in snowmen with Christmas songs and stories like "Frosty the Snowman," now an icon of winter and the winter holidays. Snowmen have evolved over the centuries to what we see today. Snowmen are also made from all artistic mediums depending on where you live; snow, fabric, shaving cream, paper mâché, or sand can be used to make a snowman. What will your snowman look like this winter?

Tips for building the perfect snowman. 1. Use the right snow (slightly wet). 2. Start with a strong base (the bigger and wider = the sturdier). 3. Create the middle and head (stack them on top of each other and press together to keep in place). 4. Add personality (make your snowman how you want with various nature items for eyes, nose, mouth, and arms). 5. Make it last (lightly spray your

Fun fact: In other parts of the world people build other objects out of snow. In Japan they make snow rabbits or 雪うさぎ (yukiusagi). Snow lanterns (balls of snow piled in a cone-shape) are another idea that brightens the night and are a tradition in Scandinavian countries and Japan. Swedish snow lanterns are known as snölykta.
