

Beach Renovations and Updates

Crews from O'Brien Civil Works have been working through all types of weather this past month while installing retention walls along the length of the shade structures and around the stairs from the parking lot down to the beach. The retention walls are to help with erosion control and washouts of sand from the top part of the beach down to and into the lake. The remaining work includes the installation of an access control post and rope fencing, pouring concrete to include a much more usable two-tier seating and observation area by the boat launch, and installation of a boat dock and launch system. Upgrades are scheduled to be completed by Memorial Day Weekend.








Informational Videos

Pool 1 Mechanical Room Renovation





Memorial Tree Program

With Spring just beginning we want to bring our NEW MEMORIAL TREE program back into full bloom! While we are all aware we have lost a few trees over the years due to disease and mother nature, this program is designed to help reforest Woodhaven along with remembering all those loved ones who truly enjoyed Woodhaven. We had a great response last year and plan to continue the program for many years to come!

There are predetermined areas for the location of memorial tree planting, depending on the type of tree you choose. Cost of a memorial tree is \$200, which also includes a staked plaque to commemorate your loved one, as well as trunk protection and mulch. Participants in this program are welcomed and encouraged to assist with care and maintenance of your tree, such as watering, pulling weeds, or pruning broken branches. Please note – no additional "keepsakes" will be allowed to be placed around Memorial Trees.

Location Option 1: Northwest trail of Pine Lake.

This option will be dedicated as the "Memorial Trail." This location will offer ornamental/flowering trees to create beautiful views while walking along the trail.

Location Option 2: Common Area Reforestation

This option includes 3 potential locations; these locations will be in common areas and only allow for hardwood varieties such as oaks and maples. The locations will be designated areas in Section 29, Mikes Pond in section 6, and Section 8/Section 9 improved trail. These options are designed to help reforest Woodhaven in areas that have been devastated by the tornadoes.

Planting of this year's trees will take place in late fall/early winter. In order to participate in this round, orders must be placed by Monday, August 18.







Woodhaven Weather Alert Siren Info

Here is a quick refresher on Woodhaven's procedures for weather notifications and tips for taking shelter during inclement weather at Woodhaven.

- » Note: there is NO all clear siren, you should use your own judgment for leaving sheltered areas. Our procedures are mirrored after other cities and municipalities. In fact, NO municipalities in Illinois have "All Clear" signals, as weather is unpredictable.
- » We cannot tell you what the safest option is for you, personally. All comfort stations and any OPEN facilities will be available for shelter. But please keep in mind that traveling in vehicles can be just as dangerous.
- » Have a Plan! Practice your family's procedure and make sure all members know what to do in case of inclement weather.
- » Invest in a weather radio and have plenty of batteries. The most up-to-date info will be released through the NOAA weather radio and the National Weather Service.

The objective of Woodhaven's Siren procedures provides advanced warning for staff and general Woodhaven public of conditions present for the development of a tornado/funnel cloud in the immediate Woodhaven Lakes area. The sirens warn to say tuned to local weather reports and to be prepared to take cover. Please remember, these are *outdoor* warning sirens and are not meant to be heard when indoors.

The sirens are activated when:

- » Woodhaven Lakes receives a report by the NOAA weather radio, TV report, or public radio from the National Weather Service of a tornado warning that includes the following areas: Amboy, Sublette, Woodhaven Lakes, southeast or southwest parts of Lee County.
- » A phone call from the Lee County Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) or Lee County Sheriff's Department that a funnel cloud or tornado is heading toward Woodhaven.

Reminder - Sirens are tested the first Tuesday of each month at 10 a.m., barring inclement weather. In inclement weather, testing is moved to the following week.

FIRE BAN FLAGS

- At times it may be necessary to place a fire ban into effect. A fire ban is set up to protect Woodhaven from the threat of fire. When a fire ban is implemented, Public Safety will take immediate action to ensure the safety of the Association. As part of this protocol, a red magnetic flag will be affixed to all active patrol vehicles, on the driver's side roof between the windshield and light bar.
- Purpose of the red flag The red flag serves as a clear visual indicator that a fire ban is in effect. This measure is crucial for maintaining awareness among all personnel and the public regarding the current fire ban status.
- Duration of the red flag The red flags will remain on patrol vehicles until the fire ban has been lifted.

Guidelines for issuing a fire ban include but are not limited to:

- 1. Any wind advisory, warning or red flag warning issued by the National Weather Service
- 2. Sustained winds 20 mph or greater
- 3. Wind gusts 30 mph or greater
- 4. Dry/drought conditions
- 5. A combination of the above or other extenuating circumstances

Once in effect, a fire ban restricts the following:

- 1. Building a campfire in any manner
- 2. Smoking a pipe, cigar, or cigarette outdoors (It is legal to smoke in a vehicle equipped with an ashtray.)
- 3. Throwing matches, ashes, or burning materials from a vehicle
- 4. Burning combustible materials in any or all restricted areas

Fire ban notifications will be sent out via the Woodhaven App And Facebook page.



Their mission statement is "to collect, review and analyze data related to Woodhaven's deer population and make recommendations to the Board of Directors based on this data for the purpose of maintaining a well-balanced and healthy deer herd at Woodhaven."

Deer Management Ad-Hoc Committee

6/15/2024 - The motion was made and approved "to follow through with obtaining a Deer Population Control Permit.'

The motion was made and approved "to not wait for CWD confirmation then let the IDNR manage the situation.'

The motion was made and approved "to follow through with neighboring landowner/ hunter incentives.

7/20/2024 - The motion was made and approved "to approve the Deer Population Control Permit recommendation to the board." This recommendation will be presented to the **Board of Directors**

8/25/2024 - The Board of Directors approved the Deer Management Committee recommendation to the board as written.

10/26/2024 - The committee met with members from Galena Territories to discuss their deer management program and some of the hurdles they overcame for a healthy deer population.

3/15/2025 – The committee met via zoom to discuss the following: Deer pick up report, deer count report, neighboring landowner harvest numbers, legislation in Springfield and the deer population control permit.

There are two meetings tentatively scheduled for 2025. June 21st and September 20th.

Bluegill 101


Of all the freshwater fish in North America, Bluegill is one of the most important fish species. Their presence in lakes, streams, ponds, etc. is critical to a balanced and healthy fishery. It can make the quality of the fishery great, however it can also make it very poor and

Characteristics:

- Bluegills are omnivorous. Their diet can consist of insect larvae, crayfish, leeches, snails, other smaller fish, algae and a variety of other food sources.
- Bluegill is also a forage fish for Bass, larger sunfish, Walleye, Catfish among other things.
- Having a healthy amount of Bluegill will help grow the size and population of other larger game fish (Bass, Walleye, Catfish, etc.)
- They are shallow water fish making them fun and easy to catch for anglers of any experience level.
- The spawning season is longer compared to other species of fish. It ranges from late May to August with June typically being the peak spawning season.
- Once the eggs are laid the larger males stay near the nests and fend off any predator that comes near them. They are typically more aggressive, which causes the older, bigger males to be the easiest to catch when fishing.

How can anglers help with the Bluegill population? It's as easy as 1-2-3!

- tion and be honest on your catch limit. Please throw back the larger male fish
- so that reproduction can occur.
- Instead of fishing for the easier sunfish try your hand in catching a different species of fish.

DAILY CATCH LIMITS AND RULES - 2025

- 1. Woodhaven Lake largemouth bass harvest up to 3 fish under 12 inches and "Catch & Release" on fish 12 inches and greater. Walleye - limit 2 per day (16 in minimum length)
- Bass Lake largemouth bass harvest up to 3 fish under 12 inches and "Catch & Release" on fish 12 inches and greater.
- Pine, Sunset, Black Oak, Hidden & Bluegill lakes 1 largemouth bass/ day, 14 inch minimum length limit.
- All Lakes 15 fish combined catch limit on bluegill and redear species.
- All lakes 15 fish limit on crappie
- All Lakes 4 fish limit on channel catfish.
- All lakes return grass carp to the lake
- All lakes No limit on common carp, bullhead, and green sunfish species.
- All lakes NO MINNOWS: using live minnows can introduce unwanted species/organisms into our lakes.
- 10. No harvesting of turtles. This is geared mainly towards snapping turtles in which populations have been declining in the State over the years due to overharvest.
- 11. 2 poles and line only in the water at a time for all the lakes on property. With this restriction, anglers would be allowed to have multiple poles but only 2 lines in the water at a given time.
- 12. No unattended fishing devices allowed at any time on any of the lakes. Unattended devices can cause mortality to fish and turtles that should be released if undersize as well as interfere with boaters using the lakes.
- 13. No trotline or jug fishing on any of the lakes. Given our fisheries are recreational, I believe these devices are damaging to our fisheries and interfere with boaters using the lakes.

Perhaps the most common violations noted by the ESAC Department are building materials being stored on a property without an open construction permit and inappropriate storage of items.

Building materials are allowed on a property provided there is an open construction permit for the property for which the materials are to be used. For example, if a Property Owner has an open permit for a deck, they would be allowed to have deck boards, lumber, railing, deck blocks and other related materials on their property. This would not cover items which would not be used for constructing the deck such as windows, siding, fire pit blocks and so forth. If these items are noted on the property, the Property Owner would be sent a letter advising them there are building materials on the lot which need to be used, removed or stored appropriately out of sight. Burnable wood which is not being used for construction may be cut to 18" to 24" sections and stacked neatly on the property as firewood. As a reminder, building materials may not be placed in Woodhaven's dumpsters.

Construction permits are valid for 180 days (six months). Once the permit has expired, all left-over materials should be removed or stored appropriately out of sight.

There is often confusion as to what is considered "out of sight." For ESAC's purposes, if items can be seen by our inspectors when walking the property, it is not out of sight. Examples of inappropriate storage would include items stored behind a shed, inside a screen room or under a structure such as an RV, room or deck that is not skirted. Even if your property backs up to common property, items still cannot be stored behind a structure. Not being able to be seen from the road does not necessarily mean it is out of sight. Items may be stored under a structure that is skirted.

Items not appropriate for recreational camping are not to be visibly stored on the campsite. Functioning grills, lawn furniture and items that are appropriate for camping should be stored in a neat, orderly fashion on the campsite. A lawn mower, which is in functioning condition, may be stored on a campsite, however mowers that appear dilapidated or non-functioning need to be removed or stored appropriately out of sight. We may ask that a mower be started in the presence of an ESAC Inspector to verify operability. We also recommend if you have multiple lawn mowers, that they be stored in a shed as there should only be one functioning mower visible on a campsite at any time.

As always, should you receive any notification from the ESAC Office, it is important to contact us as soon as possible if you have any questions, to discuss your plans for compliance or a possible extension. Spring is a time to see many different plants leafing out, many with flowers. But what about flowerless plants like ferns? Ferns grow in different shapes and sizes. They use spores to reproduce and spread. When ferns start to come up in the spring, the leaves, or fronds, begin to unfold and are called fiddleheads. Growing in ancient tropical swamp forests, ferns are an old plant type living Sensitive over millions of years ago. Ferns have adapted to almost all environments



including forests, deserts, tropics, alpine, and aquatic. They are hairy water-clover with its 4-leaf clover leaves.



There are between 10,500-15,000 species of ferns in the world, 380 kinds in North America, and 110 in Illinois. While 110 sounds like a lot, half of them occur in nine or fewer counties and 30 of them grow in only one county. That's nine out of 102 counties in Illinois. We have some species of ferns around Woodhaven as well including ebony spleenwort, lady fern, sensitive fern, and royal

fern. Ferns need good quality habitats to survive, so keeping those areas protected is important.

Did you know that all the fossil fuel used today comes from the fossil remains of large lycophytes and ferns that lived during the Carboniferous Period 300 million years ago? That means coal, oil, and natural gas all come from these fern fossil remains and is a finite source.



Memorial Day at the Nature Center: Hike over to the Nature from horizontal rhizomes underground. Center this summer to discover all our new exhibits, displays, and activities we have to offer about nature! We've been working all winter to create these new displays for you to find out more about dragonflies, badger, deer, and so much more! This year the Nature Center will have a Rainforest focus with an exhibit on rainforests of the world, the nature journal focusing on rainforests, the Kid's Area taking on a rainforest theme, and some of our programs throughout the season taking a closer look at rainforest animals! Nature Nuggets: Let's take a closer look at local nature!

Let's take a closer look at Illinois' native Trilliums (Trillium spp.)! Spring is when the star-like blossoms of the trillium fill the forest

floors. Illinois is home to nine native trillium species. There are around forty-three species worldwide with thirty-eight found in North America. Most of the species in the U.S. are found in the eastern states. All trillium species have many common factors that identify them as trilliums. The most common species in our area are White Trillium, Large-flowered Trillium, and Prairie Trillium.



Identifying a trillium starts with the name: "tri" meaning "three." All trilliums have three petals and three sepals, as well as three "leaves" or bracts. They grow

The plant does not produce true leaves or stems above ground. The "stem" is an extension of the rhizome. Above ground the bracts produce a leaf-like structure that works like typical plant leaves for photosynthesis.

Trilliums are typically split into two groups: pedicellate (flower sits on a pedicel stem-like object) and sessile (no pedicel so the flower appears to rise directly from the bracts). Illinois species have flowers in white, red/maroon, and green. The plants can grow up to two feet tall. They bloom in mid-to-late spring for 2-3 weeks.

Nodding Trillium (Trillium cernuum) is an Illinois State Endanamazing new and returning programs to offer all throughout the gered species. The pedicellate flower is white and hangs down, or nods, leaving the flower to drop below the "leaves." The plant is similar to the more common White Trillium, except for the color of the anthers being pinkish purple.

> Trillium (Trillium cuneatum) Not much is known about this species in Illinois due to misidentification with other species.

> Purple Trillium (Trillium erectum) is an Illinois State Endangered species and restricted to a few counties of the northern part of the state. The maroon open flower is a pedicellate trillium.

White Trillium (Trillium flexipes) is found in the top half and southern end of Illinois. It is one of the tallest trillium species and



is found in ravine valleys with sugar maple, chokecherry, red oak, basswood, and American beech. The flower is a white pedicellate trillium. Found in Lee County.

Large-flowered Trillium (Trillium grandiflorum) is mostly found in

northern Illinois. This pedicellate trillium has a large white flower that grows 3-4 inches across. Found in Lee County.

Snow Trillium (Trillium nivale) is found in the top half of Illinois, especially around the middle counties. It lives in areas of limestone soils and steep eroded forested slopes along streams. This plant is a smaller species, growing 6-inches tall. The peduncle is short at ½ inches long, holding a white flower on top. Found in Lee County.

Prairie Trillium (Trillium recurvatum) is the most common of all trilliums in Illinois, found in every county. One of the sessile-type flowers, prairie trilliums have maroon flowers with 3 petals that grow upward with tips touching. The "leaves" are spotted in color. Found in Lee County.



Sessile Trillium (Trillium sessile) is found on the east side of Illinois and a few counties in the southern tip. This plant likes low, rich bottom wooded valleys. A sessile flower of maroon, the petals curve together at the tips.

Green Trillium (Trillium viride) is an Illinois State Endangered species. It can be found on rich or rocky wooded slopes, generally in limestone areas in only a few counties near the Mississippi River

area. This sessile-type flower is green in

How can we help trilliums? Leave them where they are. Trilliums are a beautiful plant that's admired by many, but they are subject to pressure from overzealous collectors. If you'd like to have trilliums in your garden, visit a reputable plant nursery to purchase. White-tailed deer can also be a problem for all trillium species. The foliage

is vulnerable to browsing from deer, causing a decline in trillium populations in parts of Illinois. Finally, habitat loss also plays a significant role in the loss of species. Changes in the environment are causing major problems for many plant and animal species because many like trilliums, need specialized habitats to survive.

Fun fact: Trillium seeds are primarily distributed by ants! Ants are attracted to the protein-rich elaiosome on the seeds which they eat after carrying the entire seed back to their nests. The actual seeds are not harmed, later being discarded to grow a new plant.

RESTRICTED MATERIALS PROCEDURES

In order to provide Owners a way to dispose of restricted items in the refuse industry, we have provided roll off dumpsters at the Maintenance Shop; dumpsters are accessible 24/7. Please make note of limits and pricing. Items that have a fee will need to be paid for at the Association Office prior to being taken to the dumpsters.

Materials we will accept

Appliances(white goods): Refrigerators, freezers, ranges, water, heaters, air conditioners, and humidifiers; 1 per lot Electronics: laptops/monitors/keyboards; 3 per lot, \$5 per item TVs: 1 per lot, \$25

Microwaves: 1 per lot, \$5

Propane Tanks: 20 pound cylinders only; 1 per lot

Concrete: We will accept a wheelbarrow-sized load or smaller Furniture: We will accept all furniture unless it is determined to be a health hazard; 3 per lot

Metals: Large; 1 per lot | Small; 5 per lot

Large - lawn mowers, grills, swing sets, patio sets

Small - lawn chairs, lawn ornaments, bird feeders

Construction/Demolition Debris: we will only accept small amounts, for example, a wheelbarrow-sized load; limit 1 load per lot, or bring extra loads at a cost of \$5.00 per wheelbarrow load. The material must be clean, no nails, spikes, staples, etc. Property Owners are required to obtain their own container from a waste hauler for construction or demolition projects generating larger amounts of debris.

Materials we will NOT accept

Hazardous chemicals: paint thinner, turpentine, herbicides, pesticides, fertilizers, etc- contact your local recycler

Liquids of any kind: anti freeze, fuels, etc - contact your local O'Reilly's, AutoZone, or car service center

Oils: motor oil, vehicle lubricants, cooking oils, etc- contact your local O'Reilly's, AutoZone, Tire/Lube Center

Unsolidified paint: Oil based: contact your local recycler, Latex: cat litter or paint hardener to solidify (available at Woody's True Value) Tires: Contact your local tire dealer

Batteries: Contact your Home Depot, Staples, etc.

Fluorescent bulbs: contact your local Home Depot, Lowes, or Battery Plus Bulbs center

Any of the above items that are brought to the drop-off will be marked by staff so their origin can be identified if found in an outlot or in or near a garbage container.
