MANAGEMENT REPORT

After a long winter and a few weeks of cleaning, prepping, and opening your campers, the camping season has finally arrived! Your staff and Board have been working hard behind-the-scenes during the off-season so you can thoroughly enjoy the upcoming recreational season with your family and friends. We truly hope you and your family participate in all of the recreational programs and activity this summer has to offer including dancing to live entertainment at the Pavilion, shopping at an Open-Air Market, taking an educational hike with Nature Center staff, swimming at the beach or pools, reeling in a big fish from one of the lakes, or best yet, sitting around a cozy campfire with your family and friends sharing stories and laughs.

While not as exciting as enjoying all the programs and services Woodhaven has to offer, one of the best ways to truly enjoy Woodhaven is to have a good understanding of the Rules and Regulations, and all Woodhaven’s governing documents for that matter, so you and your guests can remain stress-free while spending time here. We understand that some believe there are way too many rules for “just a campground”. But Woodhaven is way more than “just a campground”, and a summer holiday weekend population of almost 14,000 mostly happy campers reinforces that—and justifies the need for clear and concise rules to help govern and maintain a sense of security, especially during these busy times. It’s especially important for you as an Owner to relay all relevant Rules and Regulations to your family members or guests, especially when they are out at Woodhaven enjoying time when you are not with them on property. Please remember, your guests are YOUR responsibility while enjoying Woodhaven, whether you are here with them or not. And that is also why it is extremely important to know who has access to your property passes and when they are using your property.

While Woodhaven’s Rules and Regulations were initially adopted in the early 1970’s, they have developed and evolved over time to meet the needs of the community and current climate.

As times continue to change, so do the needs of Woodhaven. As stated in Article VII, Section 1 of Woodhaven’s By-Laws, “The Board of Directors shall: c. Adopt such rules and regulations relating to the use of Association property, as it may deem reasonably necessary for the best interest of the Association and its Membership.” Woodhaven’s Board of Directors reviews the Rules and Regulations annually to determine Woodhaven’s most up-to-date needs and how they relate to our Rules and Regu-

lations. Your staff and Board have reviewed and recommended some minor changes to your Rules and Regulations based on staff and Property Owner feedback, and those proposed changes were published in the April 2026 issue of the *Woodhaven News* for your review. When the Board adopts the proposed changes, a full copy will be printed in the *Woodhaven News*. You can find all of Woodhaven’s governing documents on Woodhaven’s website, the Woodhaven mobile app and can also be picked up at the Association Office.

The Lights of Woodhaven

One of the greatest things about Woodhaven is the beautiful natural setting and surroundings, far away from the bright city lights that drown out the immensity of the stars and planets in the night sky. We understand the need for you to protect your property, and lighting and motion lights are one of the best methods to do so. The lighting options now available are both more diverse and more intense than when Woodhaven was founded back in the early 70s, making it very easy to light up your properties to city-light levels and intensities. Because of this, we must find a balance between protecting our properties and trying to keep the true essence and purpose of Woodhaven—to enjoy the beauty of nature including the stars above.

The only rule governing lights at Woodhaven falls under Article VII, Section 7, Letter G. Light Shields, which states: “If a light illuminates neighboring lots, then a shield shall be placed around the light to prevent the light’s direct illumination onto other properties.” It’s a fairly simple rule and has been effective for the most part but doesn’t completely address light intensity or pollution. We have received several Speak-Up Sheets in the past months about Dark Sky initiatives and preserving the night sky here at Woodhaven. While we don’t know what rule modifications or changes can be made to help with these initiatives, we will certainly spend time investigating possibilities over the coming season and address them as needed through the Rules and Regulations review for next year.

Other News and Notes

The new Trailside Building, which will be home to the new fitness center with all new equipment and an open room suitable for small fitness classes and meeting space, is currently under construction and expected to be completed by July 1. Check out the photos on the next page.

BY-LAWS REGARDING QUALIFICATIONS FOR BOARD OF DIRECTORS CANDIDACY

SECTION 4. QUALIFICATIONS OF DIRECTORS & CANDIDATES
a) A Director shall be an Owner in good standing, at least twenty-one (21) years of age. An Owner in good standing is an Owner current in the payment of assessments and not in violation of any provision of the Declaration of Covenants, By-Laws, or Rules and Regulations of the Association; or of resolutions as adopted by the Board of Directors.

b) If there are multiple Owners of a single campsite, only one of the multiple Owners shall be eligible to serve as a Member of the Board at any one time.

c) No Owner can be a candidate for a Director if their Campsite is their primary and principal residence.

d) Every candidate for the Board of Directors shall, prior to receiving a petition of nomination for candidacy and prior to taking a position as a Member of the Board, sign an oath attesting to the qualifications as set forth herein. Further, every Board Member shall annually reaffirm this oath as a condition to remain on the Board. All candidates to the Board and all Members of the Board shall sign a disclosure statement indicating any potential conflict of interest or any fact or potential act which may directly or indirectly affect the Association or any of its subsidiaries or ventures.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE WOODHAVEN ASSOCIATION
2026-2027 Annual Budget Report

WHEREAS, the Woodhaven Association (the “Association”) is governed by and through a duly elected Board of Directors (the “Board”) pursuant to the Declaration of Covenants and By-Laws; and

WHEREAS, Article VII Section 1 Powers – of the By-Laws provide details on the Board’s authority to manage and control the affairs of the Association; and

WHEREAS, Article VIII Section 1, of the By-laws state, “The Board shall annually ... adopt or reaffirm a tentative five-year plan for Operating Expenses, Replacements, and approved Capital Additions.”; and

WHEREAS, Article VIII Section 2, of the By-laws state, “The Board shall annually ... adopt budgets for the Operating Fund and Restricted Fund of the Association.”; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors and Finance Committee have received copies of 2026-2027Annual Budget Report and have reviewed the contents of this document to ensure it represents our collective efforts in meeting the fiduciary responsibilities of the Association.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. 1. That the contents of the 2026-2027 Annual Budget Report were developed through the budget process that began in September 2025. The assessments of \$1,710 for lots with sewer services and \$1,580 for lots without sewer services were established based on the information contained within this report, which includes information on the following items:

• Chart of Account Descriptions

• Budget Worksheets

• Monthly Line-Item Projections

• Cash Flow Projections

• Long-Range Plans

• Five-Year Projections

• Reserve Plan Reports

• New Project Funding Reports

• Debt Funding Plans

2. Specific line items within this report have been adjusted from the information presented on November 8, 2025, at the Budget Hearing. The attached spreadsheet provides a summary of the adjustments made to the Operating Fund through this year’s budget process. The following points summarize the budget changes made after November 8, 2025, Budget Hearing:

• Operating fund projections decreased the projected deficit by <\$180,472> to a net estimate of <\$106,824>. Changes made include adjustments to the *Woodhaven News* and *Lei-*

- sure Times publications, collection expenses and income, adjustments for income tax planning, and other adjustments recommended by management. Changes include:
- » Net increase in other income is \$53,084.

» Net decrease in expenses is \$127,388.
- Restricted fund projections have been updated to include seven carryover items related to 2025-2026 projects that will not be completed prior to March 31, 2026. The net value of the carryover projects is \$794,600 and includes the following items:

» Exercise Equipment \$43,500

» Trailside Replacement \$550,000

» Solar Improvements \$128,100

» Road Improvements \$25,000

» Beach Renovations \$3,000

» Sports Core Court Improvement \$18,000

» Woodhaven Lake Court Improvement \$27,000

The Restricted Fund projection for other income has been increased based expected credits from the solar improvement projects estimated at \$470,000.

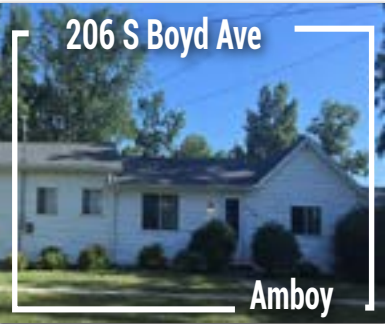

ESAC CORNER

The following are some concerns we hear from Property Owners:

“ESAC is at it again.” “ESAC must be bored.” These statements have been posted on social media when a Property Owner has received a notice of violation on their property. The truth is, ESAC performs lot inspections year-round. We are not performing inspections because we are bored or have nothing else to do. Simply put, that is our function. Our inspections are typically the result of a previous notification, an open permit or a pinning inspection on either your lot or a neighboring lot.

“What do you expect me to do about this in the middle of winter?” “Why do you send notices in the middle of winter when you know Property Owners are not coming out?” Again, the ESAC Office operates year-round. It is true that many Property Owners don’t come out to Woodhaven in the winter; however, many do. It would be impossible for us, not to mention discriminatory, to monitor lots and only cite properties that are used in the winter. The expectation is that the Property Owner will contact our office and advise us of when they will be returning to Woodhaven to address the issues. In doing so, we can work with the Property Owner by giving an extension to comply with a timeframe that works for them and not some arbitrary date determined by our office.

“My lot is one of the nicest ones out there. Why are you nit-picking something so minor?” Just because a property is beautiful, doesn’t mean there aren’t violations on the lot. Basically, a violation is a violation. We do not cite based on the severity of an issue. When an inspector sees a violation, they will typically inspect the entire property to note any and all violations on the lot. We cannot simply look the other way just because the violation is not a major safety hazard.

“I just fixed the violations from the last time and now you have found new ones. Why weren’t these found the first time?” In a perfect world, we would note every issue at one time. Unfortunately, with three full-time inspectors some things may be noted by one inspector that were missed by the previous inspector. We understand this can be very frustrating and we make every attempt to prevent this from occurring.

“It seems like you are citing me every month.” That is possibly correct. When an issue is found on a property, a letter is generated and sent to the Property Owner. If nothing is done within 30 days or the Property Owner has not called our office to request additional time to correct, a Warning Citation is issued. If, in another 30 days, there has been no correction and no con-

tact from the Property Owner, then a First Citation is issued. This process continues every 30-45 days until the property is brought into compliance, the Property Owner contacts our office for an extension, or the property reaches a 4th Citation which takes them to the Board of Review.

“Why aren’t you doing something about my neighbor’s run-down property?” These properties are typically going through or have been through the citation process. The citation and abatement process is long and time consuming. Just because you are not seeing improvement on the lot or seeing the property listed in the newspaper, doesn’t mean the ESAC Office is not working on bringing the property into compliance.

“Why are there so many more citations being issued now? Are the new inspectors trying to make a name for themselves?” There is no incentive for our inspectors to issue more citations. Nor would it be within their power to do so. Property Owners have at least 60 days to address issues on their property before a fine is assessed or their section and lot are noted in the newspaper. The inspectors would have no possible way of knowing which Property Owners would address their issues and which would not. While our lead inspector has been with the ESAC Office since its inception in 1985, the other two inspectors have now been in their current positions for eight years and three years, respectively, and are well established in these positions.

“I never received the notices because you sent them to my old address.” “The notices were going to my father’s address, and he passed away last year.” The ESAC Office sends notifications to the owner of record at the address on file with the Association. If there has been a change,, such as moving, divorce, death, it is the responsibility of the Property Owner or their next of kin to notify the Association of the changes and update their records. It would be impossible for ESAC or the Association to know there has been a change without being notified.

Again, the ESAC Office works diligently year-round to enforce the Rules and Regulations as established by the Board of Directors. Our goal is not to be punitive and we will do everything we can to work with a Property Owner prior to issuing a citation. Communication with our department is essential to addressing issues prior to a citation being issued. e-bike rules & safety tips

With the recent addition to our Rules & Regulations regarding e-Bikes, the Board of Directors wanted to provide some safety tips to those wishing to enjoy the use of electric bicycles at Woodhaven Lakes

Rules & Regulations - Article II, Section 1, G.

Low-Speed Electric Bicycles (e-Bikes). The State of Illinois recognizes three classifications of low-speed electric bicycles. They are:

- "Class 1 low-speed electric bicycle" means a low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.
- "Class 2 low-speed electric bicycle" means a low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle and that is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 20 miles per hour.
- "Class 3 low-speed electric bicycle" means a low-speed electric bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches a speed of 28 miles per hour.

1. Class 1 low-speed electric bicycles, as defined in the Illinois Vehicle Code, are recognized and allowed to be operated as a bicycle within Woodhaven.
2. Class 2 and Class 3 low-speed electric bicycles are prohibited from operating within Woodhaven.

Sirens are for **OUTDOOR** warning purposes and are not meant to be heard indoors.

Hearing a siren is a signal to get indoors and seek additional information.

It does **NOT** mean the threat has ended when the sirens stop sounding.

Sirens are activated by city or county officials, not the National Weather Service.

Woodhaven Weather Alert Siren Info

Here is a quick refresher on Woodhaven's procedures for weather notifications and tips for taking shelter during inclement weather at Woodhaven.

- » **Note: there is NO all clear siren**, you should use your own judgment for leaving sheltered areas. Our procedures are mirrored after other cities and municipalities. In fact, NO municipalities in Illinois have "All Clear" signals, as weather is unpredictable.
- » We cannot tell you what the safest option is for you, personally. All comfort stations and any OPEN facilities will be available for shelter. But please keep in mind that traveling in vehicles can be just as dangerous.
- » Have a Plan! Practice your family's procedure and make sure all members know what to do in case of inclement weather.
- » Invest in a weather radio and have plenty of batteries. The most up-to-date info will be released through the NOAA weather radio and the National Weather Service.

The objective of Woodhaven's Siren procedures provides advanced warning for staff and general Woodhaven public of conditions present for the development of a tornado/funnel cloud in the immediate Woodhaven Lakes area. The sirens warn to say tuned to local weather reports and to be prepared to take cover. Please remember, these are **outdoor** warning sirens and are not meant to be heard when indoors.

The sirens are activated when:

- » Woodhaven Lakes receives a report by the NOAA weather radio, TV report, or public radio from the National Weather Service of a tornado warning that includes the following areas: amboy, Sublette, Woodhaven Lakes, southeast or southwest parts of Lee County.
- » A phone call from the Lee County amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) or Lee County Sheriff's Department that a funnel cloud or tornado is heading toward Woodhaven.

Reminder - Sirens are tested the first Tuesday of each month at 10 a.m., barring inclement weather. In inclement weather, testing is moved to the following week.

Deer Culling Overview:

- 1st deer culling took place from January 26th to January 29th.
 - 41 deer were removed from the herd.
 - The deer that were tested for CWD all came back negative
- 2nd deer culling took place on February 25th and 26th.
 - 23 deer were removed from the herd.
 - The deer that were tested for CWD all came back negative.
- A total of 64 deer removed from the deer herd.
- Since all the deer tested came back negative for CWD they were all donated to food pantries.
- A total of 2,415 pounds of venison will be donated.

Common Area Restoration:

You may have noticed on your trip throughout property some common areas that look “cleared” out. To go with the theme of “Summer Rewind” we too are resetting back the clock. What exactly does this mean, you ask? We are having the understory in some heavily dense areas cleared out of a significant amount of invasive and non-native species of vegetation. This will help native and natural vegetation to grow and allow our wooded common areas to become of much higher quality than before. With the hopeful return of the native plant life, this will also promote more native wildlife to return to the area. Our goal is to allow these areas to return to their natural, unmaintained state, but in a much healthier and more diverse manner.

Responsible Fishing:

Hello fellow anglers! Spring is upon us, which means the fishing season is here. We love that fishing is very popular here. We ask that everyone please keep all aspects of nature in mind when enjoying the wonderful outdoors. PLEASE clean up all trash and fishing equipment when you are done fishing for the day. This includes all trash, fishing line, worm containers, etc. The fishing line can end up harming other wildlife, while the worm containers can end up in the lake. Both occurrences are something we want to avoid at all costs. Please fish responsibly.

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LANDSCAPE WASTE LOT-to-LOT PICKUP PROCEDURE

LEAVES

VACUUM
April 15-May 31

- the vacuum can pick up loose leaves, grass clippings, pine needles, and leafy garden plants.
- pile at front of lot in 1 or more windrows
- sticks, rocks, and heavy soil cannot be mixed with leaves
- cold fire pit ashes are to be bagged

BRUSH

April 15-November 30
WEDNESDAYS

Brush should be stacked parallel to the road at the front of your lot.

PAPER BAGS ONLY
June 1-October 31

Only leaves, grass clippings, pine needles, and cold ashes may be placed in paper bags at the front of the lot. Each bag should be light enough to be picked up by one person.

VACUUM
November 1-November 30

- the vacuum can pick up loose leaves, grass clippings, pine needles, and leafy garden plants.
- pile at front of lot in 1 or more windrows
- sticks, rocks, and heavy soil cannot be mixed with leaves
- cold fire pit ashes are to be bagged

Pickup of Landscape Waste is by Sign Up ONLY

Sign up sheets will be located at:

- The Association Office
- Woody's True Value
- Woody's General Store
- Main Gate
- Woodhaven Lakes Mobile App

Each lot to be picked up must be signed up.

Questions regarding landscape waste pickup can be directed to the Resource Department.

Refrain from placing any landscape waste in or alongside dumpsters that are located throughout property. Violation of the Rules pertaining to Trash, Debris, & Refuse is an automatic Board of Review and holds a \$150-500 fine.

DAILY CATCH LIMITS AND RULES - 2026

- Woodhaven Lake - largemouth bass - harvest up to 3 fish under 12 inches and "Catch & Release" on fish 12 inches and greater. Walleye - limit 2 per day (16 in minimum length)
- Bass Lake - largemouth bass - harvest up to 3 fish under 12 inches and "Catch & Release" on fish 12 inches and greater.
- Pine, Sunset, Black Oak, Hidden & Bluegill lakes - 1 largemouth bass/day, 14 inch minimum length limit.
- All Lakes - 15 fish combined catch limit on bluegill and redear species.
- All lakes - 15 fish limit on crappie
- All Lakes - 4 fish limit on channel catfish.
- All lakes - return grass carp to the lake
- All lakes - No limit on common carp, bullhead, and green sunfish species.
- All lakes - NO MINNOWS: using live minnows can introduce unwanted species/organisms into our lakes.
- No harvesting of turtles. This is geared mainly towards snapping turtles in which populations have been declining in the State over the years due to overharvest.
- 2 poles and line only in the water at a time for all the lakes on property. With this restriction, anglers would be allowed to have multiple poles but only 2 lines in the water at a given time.
- No unattended fishing devices allowed at any time on any of the lakes. Unattended devices can cause mortality to fish and turtles that should be released if undersize as well as interfere with boaters using the lakes.
- No trotline or jug fishing on any of the lakes. Given our fisheries are recreational, I believe these devices are damaging to our fisheries and interfere with boaters using the lakes.

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NATURALIST CORNER

these birds are eating? While birds eat a variety of foods, warblers and vireos are typically considered insectivores, especially during spring and summer. They need that extra high-level protein to continue migration or fill up after a long migration, as well as feed their young once they've hatched in summer. These insects include leafhoppers, flies, beetles, caterpillars, mosquitoes, wasps, and arachnids like spiders.

While some of the spring migration is timed with the weather and amounts of daylight, a good part of the migration is timed with when insects should be available in large quantities. So, why May in northern Illinois? This is when our local native oaks like Bur and White begin to "push" their leaves from the buds, otherwise known as "budburst". When the leaves start to pop, there is a natural "buffet" of bugs and caterpillars appearing that coincide with the migration of these bird species. The birds are hungry and need the food, and the bugs are out in force. This natural occurrence is a significant phenological event and is crucial for the survival of both the bugs and the birds. Budburst is important for the bugs looking for fresh green leaves and sap to eat. Budburst timing is based on many



factors, including temperature and moisture in the environment. Many insect species are dependent on a specific type of plant, and if that plant blooms or buds out early or late, it could cause problems for the insect population. If the insect population is limited by a lack of buds and blooms, this leads to an insignificant amount of insects for the birds to eat. This is called a cascading effect. Scientists research these interactions between buds, bugs, and birds and how they interconnect with the spring season. You can research these interactions and timing in your own backyard. Try watching and writing down when you see the first leaves pop, large numbers of bugs appearing, and when you see the first warblers or vireos moving into the area to feed on these insects. Compare these dates to next year or even the next five years to see how the timing changes or stays the same.

We've been working throughout the winter to create these new displays for everyone to learn more about ponds and lakes, prairies, glaciers, and so much more! Bats are amazing! They are mammals that fly, eat mosquitoes, and use echolocation to hunt and fly! Swoop over to the Nature Center to create your specialty bat-looking binoculars to search the skies this season for some local bat species, birds, or animals throughout Woodhaven or at your campsite! We will be using tp tubes to create this craft. While supplies last.

Nature Nuggets: Let's take a closer look at local nature!

Let's take a closer look at Illinois' native spring flower, Virginia Bluebells (*Mertensia virginica*)! In mid-spring, we can find the multicolored blues and purples of the Virginia Bluebell, typically covering woodland areas that are slightly damp. This fairly common plant can be found in almost all of Illinois' counties and throughout the eastern half of the US. They can be found in the following habitats in Illinois: floodplain woodlands, bottomland woodlands, mesic woodlands, wooded bluffs, and semi-shaded floodplain areas along rivers or streams. There are other species of bluebells in the genus *Mertensia*, but they occur north or west of Illinois.



mid-May around northern Illinois. The core plant grows 12 to 30 inches tall. The stem is hairless and typically light green. Alternating light green or grayish green leaves will be up to 7 inches long and 3.5 inches wide. These leaves appear soft and floppy and will

die back by mid-summer. Quite often, this plant forms large colonies which provides cover for a variety of wildlife in spring.

With their bell-shaped flowers, the bluebell has a variety of pol-



linators visiting it during spring including long-tongued bees like honeybees, bumblebees, Anthophorid bees, and mason bees which collect both pollen and nectar. Other visitors to this beautiful plant are the giant bee fly, butterflies, skippers, and Sphinx moths including the hummingbird moth. Ruby-throated Hummingbirds also enjoy the nectar of the flowers, while white-tailed deer feed on the leaves.

Fun fact: The scientific name "*Mertensia*" honors Franz Karl Mertens, a professor of botany, while "*virginica*" refers to the plant first being collected in Virginia. The color blue is a rare color in nature, in fact only about 10% of the more than 280,000 flowering plants worldwide produce blue blooms, according to the Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden.
